Assigned to patrol, just patrol the county, 7 take calls, go to disturbances, things like that. 8 Ο. What was your duty back then? Was it the same 9 as it is now? 10 Α. Are those fair and accurate representations of 13 the area which you are responsible for as a police officer? 14 15 Α. Yes. 16 Q. Handing you what's been marked as State's 17 Exhibit No. 4. Do you recognize this? I believe this is the surveillance video from 18 Α. 19 the store. Okay. Have you watched that surveillance 20 Q. 21 video? 22 Α. dispatched to the call. He was actually the first 1 2 person on scene. So, once you got to the scene, what did you do? 3 Ο. I got with him, asked him what he saw, was 4 5 going on. And he said he had just gotten there just 6 seconds before I did. And he pointed to two white males 7 he had sitting on the sidewalk next to the car. 8 said, That's two --9 MR. GONZALEZ: Objection to hearsay, Your 10 Honor. 11 THE COURT: Okay. Can't repeat what other 12 people said unless it's what he said personally, unless it was the defendant's own statements. 13 14 0. (BY MR. ALLARD) So, what did you do? Okay. There was two white males sitting on the 15 16 I talked to them. One of them identified his 17 self to me as Mr. Erickson. Basically he said --18 MR. GONZALEZ: Objection to hearsay. 19 MR. ALLARD: That would be the exception 20 to the hearsay rule. 21 What he told me? Α. 22 THE COURT: All right. Then you may 23 continue. 24 He told me that he and Mr. Holland, Eugene 25 Holland, who was with him, also sitting on the curb, he

- pulled into Polk's, went to the store, they bought a couple items. When they came out, he noticed the tan truck parked beside his vehicle, which was the Lincoln. He saw two black males sitting in the truck. They were kind of staring at him and Mr. Holland.
 - Q. Now, the person that was telling you this, do you see that person in the courtroom today?
 - A. Yes, sir.

- Q. Would you please point to him and identify him by the clothing that he is wearing?
- A. Mr. Erickson is in the orange county jumpsuit.
 - MR. ALLARD: May the record reflect, Your Honor, that he has identified the person as the defendant, the person he was speaking to at the truck stop?

THE COURT: It will.

- Q. (BY MR. ALLARD) Then what happened?
- A. He said -- he never went into detail about how things went in part of the chain of events, but he said he had some words with the guys in the truck. The guys got out. They got into a fight. One of the guys displayed a gun. He jumped -- Mr. Erickson jumped in the truck in an attempt to get away from the guys.
- Q. Now, the truck you are referring to is the truck that is in State's Exhibit No. 7?

- A. That's correct.
- Q. Okay. Proceed.
 - A. He said the guys -- he got in the truck, hit the car, backed up, and then drove into the store while he was trying to get away from these guys. He said these guys ran towards the highway. That's the last he saw.
 - Q. Now, did the defendant tell you whose truck that was?
- A. No.

 - Q. Was their recollection of what happened consistent with what the defendant had told you?
 - A. No.

- Q. So, what did you do after you checked with these witnesses and you had conflicting testimony?
