1	(Witness sworn.)
2	THE COURT: Let's proceed.
3	EMILIO CASTANEDA,
4	having been first duly sworn, testified as follows:
5	DIRECT EXAMINATION
6	BY MR. MULDROW:
7	Q. Can you introduce yourself to the ladies
8	and gentlemen of the jury?
9	A. My name is Emilio Castaneda.
10	Q. Can you spell your first name for the
11	record?
12	A. E-M-I-L-I-O, Castaneda,
13	C-A-S-T-A-N-E-D-A.
14	Q. And how are you employed?
15	A. I'm a Houston police officer.
16	Q. How long have you been with the Houston
17	Police Department?
18	A. I've been in the police department for
19	20 years.
20	Q. What division of the police department
21	are you currently assigned to?
22	A. I'm assigned to the Homicide Division.
23	Q. How long have you been with Homicide?
24	A. For about three years.
25	Q. What other divisions were you assigned

- 1 to before you went to Homicide?
- A. I worked at East Side Division for
- 3 about -- Patrol for 13 years and also the Robbery
- 4 Division for about four years.
- Q. And during that time, have you had
- 6 training as part of the academy and then on-the-job
- 7 training?
- A. Yes.
- 9 Q. And as part of your three years in
- 10 | Homicide, have you investigated many or few
- 11 homicides?
- 12 A. I've investigated a few homicides.
- 13 Q. Were you working with Officer Sosa on
- 14 May 26th, 2011?
- 15 A. Yes, I was.
- Q. Were you on call that day?
- 17 A. Yes.
- Q. And what does that mean?
- 19 A. To be on call is if a homicide occurs in
- 20 | the middle of the night, they'll call us and we
- 21 | would have to leave from our -- wherever we're at to
- 22 qo to the scene.
- 23 Q. Did you receive a call that night about
- 24 | a homicide?
- 25 A. Yes.

1 Ο. Was it at 12909 Orleans? 2 Yes. Α. 3 Is that address in Harris County, Texas? Q. 4 Yes, it is. Α. When you arrived on the location, who 5 Ο. was there? 6 7 Α. When I arrived at the location, the 8 primary, secondary units were there and the CSU 9 officer was also. Tompkins was there also. 10 Q. And were you able to locate any 11 witnesses? 12 Α. Yes, they were in the front of the house 13 and I spoke to two of them. 14 0. Okay. And who were they? 15 One of them was the middle son, Jesus, 16 and he kind of told me what had happened and I told 17 him that we'll speak to him later about what 18 happened inside the house. 19 Q. Did y'all have a suspect at that point 20 in the case? 21 Yes, he was in the officers' -- when I 22 spoke to the primary, secondary officers, they told

me he was in the patrol car. So I went to go see

where he was at in the car and he appeared that he

was sleeping at the time.

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Q. When you and your partner arrive at the scene of a homicide, what is your procedure that y'all go through?

- A. First thing is sort of assess the scene, what's going on, what do we have there at the scene, and we break the investigation into two parts. One investigator's going to do the scene side and one is going to do the witness side.
 - Q. And in this case, which side did you do?
 - A. I was going to do the scene side.
- Q. Okay. What does doing the scene side entail?
- A. Basically describing what we have there at the scene, everything that entails that part of the investigation. So we had the victim inside the house. We had the suspect was caught outside the house. We had the witnesses give a description and describe everything that was there at the scene.
- Q. Can you describe the scene as you found it on that day for the jury?
- A. Yes. When we first arrived there, it occurred at night. We went inside. Tompkins went to show me inside where the victim was at; and as we walked into the house, I could see that there was blood on the tile. There was a hole in the

1 Sheetrock. We walked toward the back bedroom where the victim was at, and we could see that she was 2. 3 deceased there in the back bedroom.

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- Can you describe the condition of the bedroom?
- You could tell that there was a struggle there in the bedroom. The victim was laying on the -- sitting on the floor with her back up against the bed. There was just a large amount of blood on the floor, a large amount of blood on the bed. You could tell there was a lot of blood splatter against the wall, against the back wall. It was a very violent scene.
 - What was the condition of the home as a Ο. whole?
 - It seemed to be in -- just, like, a normal home. It wasn't -- it was neat but, you know, there was -- just, like, in a normal home. A little bit of disarray but nothing compared to what was we found in the back bedroom.
 - Ο. As part of doing the scene, you did a walk-through. What else did you do?
- We also went to -- they had mentioned 24 that they -- the officers had arrested the defendant 25 in the backyard. So we went to go check that area

and there's a detached garage in the back of the house where the door was open and we went to check that area to see if there was any evidence about what had happened inside the house.

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- Q. Did you find anything in the backyard in that back garage area?
- A. In the garage -- inside the garage, there was sort of, like, a room inside the garage, sort of like a bedroom. It had a T.V. It had a stereo. Sort of like, you know, just its own separate bedroom and, like, when we talked to the family, they said that sometimes he would stay in the back bedroom. And apparently that's where he was coming from when the HFD and the police officers had arrived.
- Q. Okay. After you walked through the backyard and the garage area, what did you do next?
- A. Then we went back to the house and just started to documenting -- well, we wanted to -- we found out that the kids had moved over to the neighbor's house and we learned that they had washed their hands inside the house. So we were going to deal with that issue later on. We just dealt with documenting what we found inside the house.
 - O. Okay. What in particular did you find

1 inside the house that you needed to document?

A. Obviously the victim. We noticed that there was just -- she was just completely covered in blood. A large amount of blood was coming from the left side of her body. There was a large pooling of blood to her right on the ground where apparently she was resting on her right side. You could see where there's impressions where the side of her face was on the side of the floor.

We learned later on that her kids had tried to pick her up, and so that's why there was a pooling of blood on the carpet area.

- Q. Did you locate the weapon that caused those injuries?
- A. Yes. Speaking to the officers, they -the grandmother had said that she had taken the
 weapons from the defendant; and to try to keep him
 from getting -- having access again, she put them in
 the drawer in the dresser.
- Q. Did y'all locate the weapons in the drawer in the dresser?
 - A. Yes.
- Q. Other than documenting the body, the condition of the body and locating the weapons, what else did you find at the scene?

- 1 Α. We also found -- one of the kids had 2 mentioned that he saw his father sharpening the 3 knife earlier that evening. So we thought that 4 there might be some evidence. So we found a 5 sharpener in the kitchen near the sink. And also 6 since this kid had mentioned that he was drinking a 7 lot, we found a bottle inside the trash can, an 8 empty bottle of tequila and also there was a glass 9 resting on the bumper on the vehicle inside the 10 garage.
 - Q. Was that knife sharpener out like it had been recently used?
 - A. Yes, it was just on the counter.
 - Q. And there was -- you mentioned a tequila bottle and a glass sitting on the truck bumper?
 - A. Yes.
 - Q. Was it like someone had been drinking recently?
 - A. Yes.

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- Q. Did you locate anything else there at the scene?
- A. There was damage on the wall inside the bedroom and we weren't sure if that was part of the -- part of the violence or -- but there was some holes punched in the Sheetrock inside the back

1 bedroom.

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- Q. Okay. About how much time did you spend there at the scene?
 - A. We were there for about -- almost about two and a half hours, three hours there.
 - Q. Did you have a chance to talk to the children that were there and the mother of the complainant while you were there at the scene?
 - A. Yes. We told them that we were going to interview them away from there at the Homicide Division so we could get their statements.
 - Q. Were they later interviewed at Homicide?
 - A. Yes.
 - Q. Were you the one who interviewed them?
 - A. I interviewed the children.
 - Q. Okay. And why was that?
- A. Because the grandmother and the brother
 spoke Spanish and Chuy speaks very good -- my
 partner, Sosa, we call him Chuy -- speaks Spanish
 very well and my Spanish is not as good as his and
 the kids spoke English. So I spoke to the kids to
 help him out.
 - Q. And when you spoke to the kids at Homicide, had you completed the scene side of the investigation?

- A. Yes, we went to -- before we went back to Homicide, we went back to HFD because we wanted to speak to the fire fighters and apparently he had made a statement to the fire fighters but when we got there, the fire fighters were apparently on another run. So we were going to meet with them later. So from HFD we went to Travis.
 - Q. Were you later able to make contact with the fire fighters --
 - A. Yes.

- Q. -- and get a statement from them?
- A. Yes. We got a statement from them, but as we were talking to them, they had another call. So they left, but we got the main -- the main statement that -- from the fire fighter.
- Q. Can you describe the process that you went through as part of interviewing the children that were taken from the scene to Homicide?
- A. The uncle had transported -- had drove the family over to Travis, and we had them in a room. It's what was called the crying room. And one by one we'll go ahead and interview them apart from each other so that we can get a recorded statement from each one.
 - O. And is that statement recorded?

1	A. Yes.
2	Q. Audio and video recorded?
3	A. Yes.
4	Q. And did you take a statement from each
5	of the three of them on audio and video recording?
6	A. Yes.
7	Q. After you completed the scene side of
8	the investigation and taking the statement from each
9	of the three kids, what was the next step in your
10	investigation?
11	A. The next step was I was coordinating
12	with my partner about letting him know what the
13	children had told me, and he was telling me what he
14	was getting from the uncle and from the grandmother.
15	Q. Okay. How were y'all communicating that
16	back and forth?
17	A. Whenever he would come outside of the
18	room, I would just tell him give him a synopsis
19	of what happened on each interview.
20	Q. After the interviews were completed,
21	what was the next step that you took?
22	A. Sosa called and spoke with the District
23	Attorney's Office and let them know what evidence we
24	had from the statements we gathered from the

witnesses, and the District Attorney said we could

1 file the murder charges.

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- 2 And were murder charges filed at that 0. 3 point?
 - Yes. My partner filed them.
 - After charges were filed, was there any Ο. more investigation that was done?
 - Yes. At that time I went to go -- there Α. was an autopsy done on the victim and so we needed to get the cause and manner of death from the -from the coroner, the medical examiner, and she spoke to us and told us that the -- they told us that the cause of death was homicide and the manner of death was by -- I can't think of the word right now, but by stabbing.
 - As part of examining the scene and then part of the autopsy, were you able to take a look at the complainant, Alicia Gonzalez's, hands?
 - Α. Yes.
 - Are you familiar with the term Ο. "defensive wounds"?
 - Α. Yes.
 - What does that mean? Ο.
- Defensive wounds means that there are Α. 24 cuts, scrapes, abrasions on the outside of the hands, inside the hands when someone is trying to

1 defend themselves from the -- from a blunt force, a 2 gunshot, a knife, mostly like on the knuckles, 3 inside the -- inside the hands. Did Alicia Gonzalez have wounds 4 5 consistent with defensive wounds? 6 Α. Yes. 7 Have you seen wounds like that in other Ο. 8 cases? 9 Α. Yes. And is that consistent with a person 10 Ο. 11 trying to defend themselves or block some type of 12 object? 13 Α. Yes. 14 MR. MULDROW: No further questions. 15 THE COURT: Mr. Decuir. 16 CROSS-EXAMINATION 17 BY MR. DECUIR: Officer Castaneda. 18 Q. 19 Yes, sir. Α. 20 You spoke to the grandmother? 21 Α. I didn't speak to the grandmother. Му 22 partner spoke to her. 23 Well, in your report it says that you Ο. 24 looked into a -- you looked into a dresser drawer 25 that was partially opened?

- 1 A. Yes.
- Q. And you saw two knives in there?
- A. Yes.

- 4 Q. There was blood on one knife?
- A. Yes. From what I could tell from the -
 the drawer was partially open and you could tell

 through the opening that there was blood on the

 knife.
 - Q. Did anyone take those knives and try to get fingerprints off of them?
 - A. At the scene, no.
 - Q. Do you know if they ever tried to get fingerprints off the knives?
 - A. No. Just based on the information gathered from the witnesses and from the grandmother, we know that she grabbed the knives and put them in there. She took them away from the defendant and put them inside the drawer.
 - Q. Well, it says here that she told -- she told you that she took one knife from the defendant but she found the other knife laying on the bed?
 - A. That might have been -- that might have occurred. I know -- like I said, there's many people there and so I may not have recorded it in my report but basically everybody was telling me that's

- 1 | what her statement was.
- Q. Okay. But nobody bothered to lift any
- 3 fingerprints or do anything with regard to the knife
- 4 | that was on the bed?
 - A. No.
- Q. What about the glass that you recovered
- 7 and the bottle -- the bottle of tequila? Did y'all
- 8 attempt to lift fingerprints from those items?
 - A. Not that I'm aware of.
- 10 Q. So you don't know who handled those
- 11 items?

- 12 A. From what we were told, the father was
- 13 the one that was drinking.
- Q. But you were also told that there were
- 15 three other individuals who were there with the
- 16 | father when he was drinking tequila?
- 17 A. Yes, but they weren't there when the --
- when the incident occurred, when the stabbing
- 19 | occurred.
- 20 O. Did you ever determine who made the
- 21 holes in the Sheetrock walls of the living room and,
- 22 | I think, the hallway and the bedroom?
- 23 A. Enrique said that his brother Franco
- 24 made the holes in the bedroom and that his uncle
- 25 made the holes that were in the living room and that

- they did that out of anger, you know, because of what had happened.
- Q. You observed blood on the living room tile floor?
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. Did you take samples of blood drops to see whose blood they were?
 - A. No, because the only blood that we could see was the blood of the victim's.
- 10 Q. Okay.

- 11 A. We determined -- we determined that
 12 might have been just transfer from one of the kids
 13 that was trying to do CPR on their mom.
- Q. But you didn't determine whose blood that was?
- 16 A. I don't know. If -- I'm trying to

 17 remember if Officer Tompkins had picked up a sample

 18 of that blood. No.
- Q. Okay. How far was the living room from the bedroom where the crime occurred?
- 21 A. I would say probably about 20 to 30 22 feet.
- Q. Well, is it unusual to have blood
 transfer on the doorway trim from the living room
 through the hallway area?

- A. I'm not sure what you are trying to say.
- Q. Well, wouldn't it be proper
 investigation to take a sample of that blood to see

whose blood that was?

- A. The majority of the blood at the scene was the victim's blood. I mean, if you could see how much blood was there at the scene, I mean, that was -- I don't see anybody else that had any type of injuries that was anywhere close to what the victim had.
- Q. Were either of the knives identified as the knife that the defendant was seen sharpening prior to him going into the house?
- A. No, we didn't determine what knife he was sharpening. Just one of the kids mentioned he had saw his dad sharpening the knife.
- Q. Well, was that knife sharpener on the cabinet the same knife sharpener that his dad was using outside?
- A. I didn't ask -- the information I got was from the kids and he said that he saw his father sharpening the knife.
- Q. But not necessarily the knife used in -by the defendant in the stabbing and the knife
 sharpener may have not even been that same knife

- 1 | sharpener; is that correct?
- A. Well, I can't determine that. I mean,
- 3 we were just going by what information we had at the
- 4 time.
- 5 O. Did you find a knife outside?
- A. Which knife are you talking about? The
- 7 one used in the murder?
- Q. No, no. Did you find a knife outside
- 9 that had been sharpened?
- 10 A. No, no, I don't remember seeing a knife
- 11 outside.
- Q. Now, where was the defendant when you
- 13 | arrived at the scene?
- 14 A. He was in one of the patrol cars.
- Q. And do you know from your own personal
- 16 knowledge where they found the defendant?
- 17 A. I was told by the patrol officers that
- 18 | when HFD had arrived at the scene that the defendant
- 19 was in the back -- in the back driveway raising his
- 20 hands up in the air saying, "I'm so sorry. I'm
- 21 | sorry. I'm sorry." And when he approached HFD,
- 22 | that's when the police department came behind HFD
- 23 and took him into custody.
- Q. He was told to lay on the ground by
- 25 somebody?

A. Yes.

- Q. Either HFD or the police?
 - A. Well, I don't think the fire department did that. The police department did according to the officers that supplemented this.
 - Q. He wasn't coming out of the back door?
 - A. Well, he was coming -- he was in the back driveway.
 - Q. Were there two driveways?
 - A. No, one large driveway coming from the street, coming from the west side of the house and it would curve to the detached garage, large metal building in the back.
 - Q. Did you search that metal building?
 - A. It was a large building. It's not your normal garage. It was, like, a large metal building, like a metal shop. I mean, it had large two-car doors and I didn't measure the garage, but it's very large, several -- probably fit about four or five vehicles inside that garage.
 - Q. Would y'all have -- y'all knew where the murder weapon was and y'all don't bother to look out and go through the garage and see if that -- possibly that knife and that sharpener that the child saw him sharpening was located in the garage?
