1 **(In Open Court, Defendant Present)**

2 **(Interpreter Present)**

3 **THE COURT:** On the record. This is
4 Cause No. 1351489, State of Texas Vs. Jesus Gonzales,
5 who is on deferred adjudication for aggravated sexual
6 assault of a child. And we're here today on the
7 Motion to Adjudicate Guilt.

8 On a couple of housekeeping matters,
9 by agreement of the parties, we're going to do this
10 as a unified proceeding; that is, the parties may
11 present any evidence that they would normally present
12 at punishment should the allegations be found true so
13 that the witnesses don't have to come back again at a
14 punishment phase.

15 Is that the State's agreement?

16 **MS. UHER:** Yes, Your Honor.

17 **MR. DYER:** It is our agreement, also.

18 **THE COURT:** All right. So, then I
19 will hear any punishment evidence as well as any
20 evidence as to whether the allegation should be found
21 true.

22 Also, Mr. Dyer is new on the case.
23 So, we have agreed since the State's witnesses have
24 been here all day and prepared to cross-examine them,
25 that we will -- I will hear the State's two

1 witnesses, and then I will reset it so he can have
2 some time to prepare his defense.

3 Is that all right with you, Mr. Dyer?

4 **MR. DYER:** Judge, that's -- that would
5 be all right. Thank you.

6 **THE COURT:** Okay. Thank you.

7 Do you waive arraignment, or do you
8 need the State to arraign your defendant?

9 **MR. DYER:** Judge, we would waive that,
10 in the interest of time.

11 **THE COURT:** Okay. All right. Thank
12 you.

13 And your client understands, I take it
14 then, the allegation -- would you stand, please,
15 Mr. Gonzalez?

16 Your lawyer has agreed that the State
17 does not have to read all of the allegations in the
18 Motion to Adjudicate Guilt. Do you understand what
19 the State is alleging you did while on probation or
20 failed to do on probation?

21 Do you understand the charge?

22 **THE DEFENDANT:** Yes, ma'am.

23 **THE COURT:** Okay. Thank you.

24 And in this case I will proceed with
25 the taking of the plea with regard to the Motion to

1 Adjudicate Guilt that you're same person placed on
2 deferred adjudication for aggravated sexual assault
3 of a child back on April 9, 2013.

4 And with regard to the allegations in
5 the motion as to how you violated probation, do you
6 plead that those allegations are true or not true?

7 Or do you wish to enter the plea for
8 him, Mr. Dyer?

9 **MR. DYER:** Judge, at this time we
10 enter a plea of not true.

11 **THE COURT:** Thank you.

12 Thank you. You may have a seat.

13 Who is your first witness?

14 **MS. UHER:** Lisa Apodaca.

15 **THE COURT:** Come on up, please, ma'am.
16 We will take a break from the hearing
17 very quickly.

18 *(Brief pause)*

19 **THE COURT:** Back on the record.

20 Raise your right hand to take the
21 oath.

22 *(Witness Duly Sworn)*

23 **MR. DYER:** Is he allowed to use the
24 restroom?

25 **THE BAILIFF:** Let him go to the

1 restroom?

2 **THE COURT:** Okay. All right. We will
3 wait.

4 **(Pause in the proceedings)**

5 **THE COURT:** And I have given the oath
6 right?

7 **THE WITNESS:** Yes, ma'am.

8 **THE COURT:** Thank you. This witness
9 having been sworn, you may proceed.

10 **MS. UHER:** Thank you, Judge.

11 **LISA APODACA,**
12 having been first duly sworn, testified as follows:

13 **DIRECT EXAMINATION**

14 **Q.** **(BY MS. UHER)** Ma'am, would you please state
15 your name for the record?

16 **A.** It's Lisa Flores Apodaca.

17 **Q.** And Ms. Apodaca, do you know Jesus
18 Gonzalez?

19 **A.** No.

20 **Q.** How is it -- I guess what brought you to
21 court today? Could you explain to the Court why you
22 are here?

23 **A.** The reason I'm at court today is because I
24 wasn't aware of what he was doing with his physical
25 address.

1 Q. Okay. And so, let me back up. You're not
2 friends with Jesus Gonzalez?

3 A. No.

4 Q. Okay. Did somebody come up to you and ask
5 if they could use your address for something?

6 A. They approached me if they can use my
7 address, but the thing is at the time I didn't know
8 what was going on.

9 Q. Okay. What -- what did they say they
10 wanted to use your address for, that person?

11 A. A package.

12 Q. And were you willing to let them use your
13 address so a package could be delivered?

14 A. After it was delivered, I told them that he
15 didn't -- he could not use my address no longer
16 because I didn't know what was going on.

17 Q. Okay. And the person who asked to use your
18 address, is he in the courtroom right now?

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. Could you describe what he is wearing?

21 A. He is right there in the orange.

22 MS. UHER: Okay. Your Honor, if the
23 record could reflect that she has identified the
24 defendant?

25 THE COURT: Thank you. The record

1 will show that, please.

2 **(Defendant Identified)**

3 **Q.** **(BY MS. UHER)** So, he did have a package
4 delivered to your house?

5 **A.** It wasn't a package. It was like a UPS
6 letter.

7 **Q.** Okay. And after that letter came, you
8 asked him not to use your address for anything else?

9 **A.** Yes.

10 **Q.** Did he ever live at your address with you?

11 **A.** No.

12 **Q.** Did he ever stay in your house?

13 **A.** No, ma'am.

14 **Q.** Did he ever come inside your house?

15 **A.** No, ma'am.

16 **Q.** Had you seen him before in the
17 neighborhood?

18 **A.** He grew up in the neighborhood where I
19 live.

20 **Q.** Okay. Does he have sisters? Brothers? Do
21 you know?

22 **A.** I'm not -- I'm not sure. He has family.

23 **Q.** Okay. And since this happened and since --
24 well, let me back up.

25 **A.** Because you talked to probation; is

1 that correct?

2 **A.** Uh-huh (affirmative.) Yes, ma'am.

3 **Q.** Okay. After you talked to probation, have
4 you been contacted by either the defendant or his
5 family?

6 **A.** Yes.

7 **Q.** What -- what's been going on?

8 **A.** Well, the young lady in the back row on the
9 left, she approached me; and she wanted to know if I
10 remembered her.

11 And I told her no, because I haven't
12 seen them in I don't know how long.

13 And then her father came out of the
14 back seat of the truck and was asking me to write a
15 letter stating that he lived with me.

16 And I said, No. I can get in a lot of
17 trouble for that, you know.

18 And then I just turned around and went
19 back inside. I was scared.

20 **Q.** Tell me why you were scared. Tell the
21 Court.

22 **A.** Because just that -- the way they live. I
23 don't know who they are.

24 **THE COURT:** Thank you.

25 **Q.** *(BY MS. UHER)* Were you also contacted

1 today?

2 **A.** Yes.

3 **THE COURT:** Are they people in the
4 courtroom today?

5 **THE WITNESS:** Yes.

6 **THE COURT:** You said on the back row.
7 There is nobody on the back row.

8 **THE WITNESS:** Right there
9 (indicating.)

10 **THE COURT:** Which lady is it?

11 **Q.** (**BY MS. UHER**) Describe what she is wearing
12 for the record.

13 **A.** She just raised her hand.

14 **Q.** Okay. The young lady in the red?

15 **A.** Yes.

16 **THE WITNESS:** Yes.

17 **THE COURT:** Okay. You don't know her
18 name or anything like that?

19 **THE WITNESS:** No.

20 **THE COURT:** Okay. Thank you.

21 **Q.** (**BY MS. UHER**) And then were you approached
22 by anybody else while you were up here today?

23 **A.** Yes.

24 **Q.** And he is not in the courtroom right now;
25 is that correct?

1 **A.** No. He was, but -- he is watching me right
2 now in the back window.

3 **Q.** Okay. And do you know who he is or how he
4 is related to the defendant?

5 **A.** I think he is their father. I don't know.
6 I'm not 100 percent for sure.

7 **Q.** Okay. But you believe he is also connected
8 with this case --

9 **A.** I --

10 **Q.** -- or this defendant?

11 **A.** Yes.

12 **Q.** What -- is he the same person that was at
13 your house?

14 **THE COURT:** Is that him who is -- man
15 looking in the window?

16 **THE WITNESS:** With the cowboy hat.

17 **THE COURT:** Okay. Would you ask that
18 person to step in? Someone with a cowboy hat.

19 **MS. UHER:** Red shirt, cowboy hat.

20 **THE BAILIFF:** Yes, ma'am.

21 **THE COURT:** Is this the same person
22 who was here previously?

23 **THE WITNESS:** Yes. That's the one who
24 approached me earlier, and they went to my house.

25 **THE COURT:** Okay. Can I see the two

1 of you up here, please? You may bring the child.

2 **MS. UHER:** And he doesn't speak
3 English, only Spanish.

4 **THE COURT:** And, of course, the
5 interpreter has been interpreting the hearing for the
6 defendant. So, we have an interpreter here.

7 **THE WITNESS:** She speaks English.

8 **THE COURT:** Come on up, please, ma'am.
9 Tell me your name.

10 **AUDIENCE MEMBER:** Marion Gonzalez.

11 **THE COURT:** And how are you related to
12 the defendant?

13 **AUDIENCE MEMBER:** He is my brother.

14 **THE COURT:** Your brother.
15 And, sir, your name, please?

16 **AUDIENCE MEMBER:** Romero. Romero.

17 **THE COURT:** Your last name?

18 **AUDIENCE MEMBER:** Gonzalez.

19 **THE COURT:** And are you the
20 defendant's father?

21 **THE WITNESS:** Yes.

22 **THE COURT:** Okay. I'm going to
23 instruct you if you're not in the courtroom not to
24 look in the window because I don't want it to be
25 intimidating to the witness. And I'm going to

1 instruct you not to contact her in any way.

2 You need to be careful that you're not
3 charged with tampering with a witness or retaliating
4 against a witness. She is here under subpoena, and
5 she has to testify. So, you need to leave her alone.

6 **AUDIENCE MEMBER:** Forgive me.

7 **THE COURT:** All right. So you
8 understand, don't go by her house, don't contact her
9 in any way.

10 And what did you want to tell her,
11 ma'am?

12 **AUDIENCE MEMBER:** Yes. Well, like,
13 how she said we just know each other when we was
14 child.

15 **THE COURT:** Well, you can -- your
16 brother's lawyer can call you as a witness if he
17 wants.

18 So, do the parties wish to invoke the
19 Rule?

20 **MS. UHER:** Yes, ma'am, at this point I
21 will.

22 **THE COURT:** All right. If you're a
23 witness in this case, please raise your right hand to
24 take the oath.

25 Are these two of your witnesses,

1 Mr. Dyer?

2 **MR. DYER:** They are, Your Honor.

3 **THE COURT:** Ma'am, raise your right
4 hand.

5 **(Witnesses duly sworn)**

6 **THE COURT:** And, also, the probation
7 officer.

8 **(Witness duly sworn)**

9 **THE COURT:** Okay. Put your hand down.
10 The Rule has been invoked. That means from this
11 point forward you may not discuss the case with
12 anyone except the lawyers or someone working for the
13 lawyers, such as a paralegal or an investigator. You
14 may not hear any other witness testify, so don't be
15 talking about the case even with your dad.

16 You follow that?

17 **AUDIENCE MEMBER:** Yes, ma'am.

18 **THE COURT:** And that -- the hearing is
19 going to be reset for the Defense to present their
20 case. So, that includes the time until the hearing
21 is continued. Don't talk to the -- the case with
22 anyone present except a lawyer or someone on the
23 staff. I will instruct you not to look in the
24 windows.

25 **AUDIENCE MEMBER:** Yes, ma'am.

1 **THE COURT:** Because I don't want that.

2 **AUDIENCE MEMBER:** Forgive me. I did
3 not know.

4 **THE COURT:** Okay.

5 **AUDIENCE MEMBER:** Forgive me.

6 **THE COURT:** All right. Thank you.

7 All the witnesses may step outside
8 because you cannot hear any other witness testify.

9 **(Witnesses exit courtroom)**

10 **THE COURT:** Thank you.

11 So, ma'am, if there is any problem
12 after you leave here today, you can call the police
13 or call the D.A.

14 **THE WITNESS:** I will.

15 **THE COURT:** Okay. Thank you.

16 **MS. UHER:** May I proceed?

17 **THE COURT:** You may.

18 **Q.** **(BY MS. UHER)** Ms. Apodaca, I think the only
19 other question I had is: Could you -- you know,
20 it's -- could you please tell me your address where
21 you live at?

22 **A.** My address?

23 **Q.** Yes, ma'am.

24 **A.** It's 3306 Colley Street.

25 **Q.** And is that in Houston?

1 **A.** Yes, ma'am. 77093.

2 **THE REPORTER:** Would you spell the
3 street, please?

4 **THE WITNESS:** C-O-L-L-E-Y, Street.

5 **A.** And it's my residency.

6 **MS. UHER:** I pass the witness, Judge.

7 **THE COURT:** Thank you.

8 Cross-examination?

9 **MR. DYER:** I have no questions of this
10 witness.

11 **THE COURT:** No questions?

12 **MR. DYER:** No questions.

13 **THE COURT:** May she be excused as a
14 witness?

15 **MS. UHER:** Yes, Your Honor.

16 **MR. DYER:** Yes, Your Honor.

17 **THE COURT:** Thank you.

18 You're released as a witness; but you
19 still can't talk about the case to anyone, only the
20 lawyers, until the hearing is over.

21 **THE WITNESS:** I won't.

22 **THE COURT:** Thank you so much.

23 **THE WITNESS:** You're welcome.

24 **MS. UHER:** Your Honor, the State would
25 call Manuel Chica.

1 **THE COURT:** Thank you. And this
2 witness has also taken the oath.

3 Come on up, sir.

4 **MANUEL CHICA,**
5 having been first duly sworn, testified as follows:

6 **DIRECT EXAMINATION**

7 **Q.** **(BY MS. UHER)** Mr. Chica, please state your
8 name for the record.

9 **A.** My first name is Manuel, M-A-N-U-E-L. Last
10 name, Chica, C-H-I-C-A. I'm a Jr.

11 **Q.** How are you employed?

12 **A.** As a probation officer here in Harris
13 County.

14 **Q.** And what sort of duties do you have as a
15 probation officer on a day-to-day basis?

16 **A.** Excuse me. I didn't understand.

17 **Q.** What do you do on a day-to-day basis?

18 **A.** I supervise sex offender caseload.

19 **Q.** And how long have you been doing that?

20 **A.** Here in Harris County for the last six
21 years.

22 **Q.** And are you familiar with a defendant in
23 this case, Mr. Jesus Gonzalez?

24 **A.** Yes, ma'am.

25 **Q.** And do you see him in the courtroom?

1 **A.** Yes, I do.

2 **Q.** Could you identify him by describing an
3 article of clothing he is wearing?

4 **A.** Young man to the left wearing the orange
5 jumpsuit.

6 **Q.** Just a little history, was Mr. Gonzalez
7 brought in this court previously because he was
8 living in a family house with young children that he
9 was not allowed to be around?

10 **A.** Yes.

11 **Q.** And at that point did the Court or even
12 yourself -- was he admonished that he wasn't -- that
13 he needed to find somewhere else to live?

14 **A.** Yes.

15 **Q.** And then as part of your normal duties, or
16 a probationer's normal duties when they come see you,
17 do they fill out sheets that contain blanks for them
18 to tell you where they live, if they have a job, and
19 a bunch of different questions, as well?

20 **A.** Yes, ma'am.

21 **Q.** I have put up in front of you a folder. Do
22 you recognize this as a probationer file?

23 **A.** Yes. It's Mr. Gonzalez' probation file.

24 **Q.** And then specifically on the -- what I have
25 put over as open on the side here, does that include

1 all of the sheets that Mr. Gonzalez would fill out
2 and that you would sign each time he would come
3 report to you?

4 **A.** Yes.

5 **Q.** And going back to October -- I'm sorry --
6 August, this green sheet here that's dated August 13,
7 2014, is that back when Mr. Gonzalez was living off
8 of Holtman -- Holtman street, H-O-L-T-M-A-N?

9 **A.** Yes.

10 **Q.** And that's the address that he told you he
11 was living at back then; is that correct?

12 **A.** Right.

13 **Q.** And then August 20th, he had that same
14 address; is that correct?

15 **A.** Yes.

16 **Q.** And then when we get to August 27th --
17 and the sheet's dated from that date -- did he give
18 you the information that he moved to a new address?

19 **A.** Yes, he did.

20 **Q.** And what did he list as his new address?

21 **A.** He said he moved to 3306 Colley Street here
22 in Houston, Texas.

23 **Q.** And, in fact, as part of your normal
24 course, do you plot that area to make sure that's not
25 inside a child safety zone?

1 **A.** Yes, I plot it; and I submit it for child
2 safety zone check.

3 **Q.** And every -- looks like, I guess, he
4 reported every week as best as he could?

5 **A.** Yes. I had him at one time one week and
6 once a week, and then he went to twice a month. It
7 just depends.

8 **Q.** And as we flipped -- you and I flipped
9 through these sheets earlier, correct, on his
10 reporting?

11 **A.** Uh-huh (affirmative.) Yes, ma'am.

12 **Q.** Okay. And as we continued to flip all the
13 way from that August 27th date until April 2nd date
14 of 2015 -- sorry, not that. There it is. The --
15 April 14th day of 2015, he continued consistently
16 to give you the address of 3306 Colley Street?

17 **A.** Yes, ma'am.

18 **Q.** At some point was a field visit conducted,
19 and you-all learned that he did not live at that
20 address?

21 **A.** Yes, ma'am. That was -- an officer went
22 out there and checked his residence.

23 **Q.** And as a result of that, did you talk to
24 the defendant about him having given a false address?

25 **A.** Yes, I did.

1 **Q.** And what did he tell you about that?

2 **A.** Well, first, he was adamant he was living
3 at the Colley Street residence; but after, you know,
4 further -- I continued questioning him, you know --
5 you know, what was going on and the investigation, he
6 finally admitted that he wasn't living there.

7 **Q.** Did he give you a new address and
8 subsequently report it on these probation sheets as
9 to where he was living?

10 **A.** Well, on this particular day when I
11 questioned him, he didn't know exactly where he was
12 living at. He kind of gave me a -- so, I told him to
13 give me a call and give me the address -- the
14 address. And then when he reported subsequently, he
15 indicated that address on his report form, which is
16 15163 Chipman Lane in Houston.

17 **Q.** And in regards to that address, did you
18 plot it and send to have it checked, for a child
19 safety zone check?

20 **A.** Yes, I did.

21 **Q.** And is there a problem with him living at
22 that address if, in fact, he did move to that
23 address?

24 **A.** Yes, it is because it was -- it's not in
25 compliance with a child safety zone requirement.

1 Q. What -- what makes it not in compliance?

2 A. Apparently, there was a -- it was -- in
3 less than 1,000 feet, there was an elementary school
4 and, I think, a middle school also.

5 Q. Okay. And at that point when you got that
6 information back, was this file already being sent
7 for review for purposes of staffing it with the court
8 or proceeding on a motion?

9 A. Yes. I already submitted all the
10 information.

11 Q. In addition to that issue, was the
12 defendant ordered to participate in sex offender --
13 sex offender treatment or counseling?

14 A. Yes, ma'am.

15 Q. And how was his progress in that?

16 A. He was discharged un -- unsatisfactorily
17 because he was not attending, and a therapist noticed
18 no progress was being done by the defendant.

19 Q. In addition, did the defendant fail to pay
20 all his monies as he was supposed to?

21 A. Yes, ma'am.

22 Q. And, specifically, for the most part, did
23 he tell you he was unemployed?

24 A. Yes. He would tell me he was unemployed,
25 but he would work like odd jobs here and there to

1 support himself.

2 Q. Did he make any -- as far as you could
3 tell, any solid efforts to find employment?

4 A. He made some type of effort. I mean, he
5 would make payments; but he was still delinquent.

6 Q. Did Mr. Gonzalez, other than -- well,
7 strike that.

8 MS. UHER: I pass this witness.

9 THE COURT: Thank you.

10 Cross-examination?

11 CROSS-EXAMINATION

12 Q. (BY MR. DYER) Yes. What -- the address
13 that he was staying at, did you go to that address?

14 A. The one on Chipman?

15 Q. Yes.

16 A. That he said he made it to later? No. I
17 just -- what I did is I submitted it to our
18 surveillance team to check the child safety zone for
19 this particular location, but I never went over there
20 myself.

21 Q. Okay. And you said it was less than
22 1,000 feet from a school?

23 A. Yes, sir.

24 Q. What school? What school?

25 A. I have it here. I can give it to you.

1 important that the witness and lawyer not speak at
2 the same time.

3 Mrs. Lee, did you get all of that?

4 **THE REPORTER:** Yes, ma'am.

5 **THE COURT:** Thank you.

6 **Q.** (BY MR. DYER) Do you know if Mr. Gonzalez
7 has any kids of his own?

8 **A.** No. No, sir.

9 **Q.** Maybe I didn't -- you don't know, or he
10 does not have any kids?

11 **A.** I don't know for a fact that he has any
12 children of his own.

13 **Q.** Okay. So, he could have?

14 **A.** It's a possibility, yes. But I don't know,
15 sir.

16 **Q.** Do you know if -- if his wife is pregnant?

17 **A.** I didn't know he was married.

18 **Q.** Do you know if before he was locked up, if
19 he was working full time?

20 **A.** No, he wasn't working full time. He would
21 do odd jobs, like I testified earlier, you know,
22 working for a while -- he was working for a tree
23 company, but apparently he fell down and hurt his leg
24 and he couldn't go back. And then he would do like
25 odd jobs, labor-type jobs.

1 **Q.** Okay. When he was arrested, he was working
2 full time, wasn't he?

3 **A.** My understanding is, and he was messed up.
4 He was injured, and he told me he had fell down from
5 a tree and he couldn't work there at the tree
6 company.

7 **Q.** Do you know when that -- when he fell from
8 the tree? What date?

9 **A.** No, sir.

10 **Q.** He was attending classes or therapy?

11 **A.** He was instructed to attend sex offender
12 treatment with the Paquin Clinic.

13 **Q.** Okay. And did he attend there?

14 **A.** He attended sporadically.

15 **Q.** Okay. The answer is, yes, he did?

16 **A.** No. He wasn't attending like he was
17 supposed to.

18 **Q.** The question was: Did he attend?

19 **A.** Yes, he attended.

20 **Q.** Okay. Well, that's what I asked. Sorry.
21 Is it something --

22 **A.** No.

23 **Q.** Have you talked to him since he has been
24 locked up?

25 **A.** No, sir.

1 **Q.** You didn't visit him?

2 **A.** No.

3 **Q.** Are you -- you're not supervising him at
4 this time?

5 **A.** Yes, I am. Well, it's gone up to the
6 court. So, basically, we don't follow up once they
7 leave our jurisdiction and, you know, they get
8 transferred to the court.

9 **Q.** Before he was transferred to the court,
10 when did you talk to him?

11 **A.** The day that he came in, and they arrested
12 him in my office. I don't know the exact date, but I
13 can look it up.

14 I don't have the case notes, but it's
15 the day they came to my office -- Harris County
16 Sheriff's Department -- and they took him into
17 custody.

18 **Q.** Okay. He -- was that -- did they take him
19 into custody before or after you interviewed him?

20 **A.** Actually, he came in; and I talked to him
21 briefly. And then the deputies came in and took him
22 into custody.

23 **Q.** Okay.

24 **A.** So, I really didn't much conduct an
25 interview with him on that particular day. I think

1 it's -- according to this, it might have been May
2 6th; but I'm not sure.

3 Q. Did you -- did you tell him that he was in
4 violation?

5 A. Oh, yes.

6 Q. And did he tell you that he would correct
7 those violations?

8 A. Yes. He told me he would try to do better.

9 Q. How many times, roughly, have you seen him
10 and interviewed him?

11 A. Well --

12 Q. Well, strike -- don't -- let me change that
13 a little bit.

14 A. On a -- well, you want me to answer it?

15 Q. Well, I don't -- if you have to go through
16 all your records --

17 A. No. I have it here in front of me. I
18 just -- when the file got transferred, they moved
19 things around. On an average I have been seeing
20 Mr. Gonzalez twice a month --

21 Q. Okay.

22 A. -- you know, since April -- no. Strike
23 that -- since -- by the time I got the file. Because
24 it used to belong to another officer. I think it was
25 in December of 2013, the file got transferred to me.

1 **Q.** Okay. And when you didn't see -- when you
2 did see him, would he be polite and cooperative?

3 **A.** Oh, he was a very presentable young man. I
4 mean, never disrespected. He had a good attitude.

5 **Q.** Okay. Thank you for that.

6 And when you did tell him that he was
7 not in compliance or he needed to do something more
8 or correct something or pay more or work harder or
9 get jobs, whatever advice you give him, would he
10 respond to your advice?

11 **A.** Yes. He would say, I would try to do
12 better and, you know, try to cooperate.

13 **Q.** Okay. Do you think he did?

14 **A.** On some things he did, and some he didn't.

15 **Q.** Okay. Well, let's talk about the things he
16 did. What things did he cooperate?

17 **A.** Well, he would come in and report to me.
18 He has no failures to report.

19 **Q.** And that --

20 **A.** Did test clean.

21 **Q.** Those are two things that you look for that
22 speak well of a probationer?

23 **A.** Well, he needs to do 100 percent. But when
24 it came to those things, he was pretty diligent.

25 **Q.** Okay. At least in those categories -- and

1 those are important ones, aren't they?

2 **A.** Yes. He came and reported.

3 **Q.** Okay. And as far as like employment, did
4 you think he made an effort to seek employment?

5 **A.** Well, I think he made a diligent effort to
6 do that. I mean, there is other things I didn't go
7 into; but, yes, I think he did.

8 **Q.** Okay. Did he ever talk to you about his
9 family?

10 **A.** Well, I know about his immediate family,
11 which are his parents and his sister and his brother.
12 I don't -- you know, his sister personally.

13 **Q.** Sorry. You do or don't?

14 **A.** I do know his sister because I had contact
15 with her before.

16 **Q.** And are they supportive of Jesus?

17 **A.** They give the impression they were
18 supportive.

19 **Q.** You didn't have any reason not to believe
20 that, did you?

21 **A.** Well, I had some -- like I said, my
22 dealings were not that frequent. I met them once or
23 twice. They seem like they cared about him.

24 **Q.** Okay. The violation that you are aware of
25 with not giving the correct address and not keeping

1 up with the fees, those are the main violations?

2 **A.** Yes.

3 **Q.** Okay. Were there any like violations that
4 he committed a crime other than not complying with
5 the probation requirements?

6 **A.** Are you saying -- are you asking me if he
7 committed any criminal acts?

8 **Q.** Well, I suppose not complying with all the
9 rules of probation are at least somewhat criminal. I
10 mean, did he break the law in any other way?

11 **A.** Okay. If you're asking me if he -- new law
12 violations, no.

13 **Q.** Yes, that's what I'm asking.

14 **A.** No.

15 **Q.** Okay. Thank you.

16 **MR. DYER:** Pass the witness, Judge.

17 **THE COURT:** Thank you.

18 **MS. UHER:** I just have two things.

19 **REDIRECT EXAMINATION**

20 **Q.** (**BY MS. UHER**) Mr. Chica, did the defendant
21 write you a statement about why he lied about where
22 he was living?

23 **A.** He wrote me a statement -- a statement in
24 Spanish.

25 **Q.** And is Spanish your first language, or is

1 it your second language?

2 **A.** My second language.

3 **Q.** What did his statement tell you about why
4 he -- I guess what did his statement tell you so you
5 can tell the Court what reasoning he gave for lying?

6 **A.** In translating it to English, he said:
7 Since September, 2014, I moved to Aldine Mail Route
8 Road at Hardy and I did not advise my officer because
9 I didn't think he was going to find out and I don't
10 know the address where I'm staying."

11 That's basically what he gave me.

12 **Q.** And that's the Aldine address -- or that
13 area, that is the address that turns out to be the
14 1516 -- or 15163 Chipman?

15 **A.** That is the proximity to that -- that
16 location that he mentioned.

17 **Q.** And then Defense counsel asked you if he
18 picked up any new violations, and you indicated he
19 has not; is that correct?

20 **A.** No, as far as I'm -- no, there are no new
21 law violations.

22 **Q.** And by that, he hadn't been arrested for
23 anything; but if he had registered as a sex offender
24 at this 3306 Colley Drive, that would be a new law
25 violation that he committed, even though he wasn't

1 arrested for it?

2 **A.** Correct. I did notify the sheriffs -- I
3 mean, the registration agency. They decided not
4 pursue it.

5 **Q.** Okay.

6 **MS. UHER:** I pass this witness.

7 **THE COURT:** Thank you.

8 **MR. DYER:** No further questions.

9 **THE COURT:** Is this witness excused
10 for all purposes?

11 **MS. UHER:** Yes, Your Honor.

12 **MR. DYER:** Yes, ma'am.

13 **THE COURT:** Thank you so much.

14 **THE WITNESS:** Thank you, Your Honor.

15 **(Witness released)**

16 **MS. UHER:** Judge, we would offer the
17 Stipulation of Evidence as State's Exhibit No. 1.

18 **MR. DYER:** No objection. Judge.

19 **THE COURT:** Thank you.

20 Mr. Gonzalez -- Mr. Gonzalez, if you
21 would now stand, please. You signed a stipulation --
22 for the record, the interpreter has changed. Ms.
23 Flores is here now.

24 Mr. Gonzalez, you have signed a
25 Stipulation of Evidence. Stipulation just means

1 agreement, that you're agreeing to certain facts as
2 evidence; that is, that you are the same person who
3 was placed on deferred adjudication on April 9, 2013,
4 for aggravated sexual assault, a first-degree felony,
5 in Cause No. 1351489 for a period of six years.

6 Normally, the State would have to
7 prove that; and you would have the right to require
8 the witnesses to appear in court -- excuse me -- and
9 for your lawyer to ask them questions.

10 By signing this statement, you're
11 giving up those rights and, also, you're giving up
12 your right to remain silent with regard to the facts
13 I just read. So, you're giving up your Fifth
14 Amendment right.

15 Did you sign this agreement freely and
16 voluntarily?

17 **THE DEFENDANT:** Yes.

18 **THE COURT:** And is that your signature
19 here?

20 **THE DEFENDANT:** Yes.

21 **THE COURT:** And did you talk to your
22 lawyer about it before you signed it?

23 **THE DEFENDANT:** Yes.

24 **THE COURT:** Then I will approve the
25 Stipulation of Evidence.

1 And what exhibit number is that?

2 **MS. UHER:** It's State's Exhibit No. 1,
3 Judge.

4 **THE COURT:** State's 1 is admitted.

5 **MS. UHER:** Judge, I know we talked off
6 the record before we started the hearing that the
7 State was proceeding on the single allegation in the
8 Motion to Adjudicate that alleged that he had
9 reported his residence as 3306 Colley Street.

10 **THE COURT:** So, you abandon the other
11 allegations?

12 **MS. UHER:** Yes, Your Honor. The
13 following four allegations were all financial, and
14 then the fifth allegation was the allegation that he
15 had basically done the failure to register sex
16 offender properly.

17 **THE COURT:** All right. Let me see
18 here. You're proceeding on which paragraph?

19 **MS. UHER:** The very first paragraph,
20 that he failed to notify of a change in residence and
21 he reported 3306 Colley Street and has never resided
22 at that address.

23 **THE COURT:** It must be an amended
24 motion.

25 **MS. UHER:** There should be a

1 supplemental. I can give the Court a copy.

2 **THE COURT:** I see there was a previous
3 motion at the front of the file. I will find it in
4 the file.

5 Just for the record, the probation
6 department is now using supplemental for the second
7 motion that's filed. So, this is supplemental motion
8 No. 1. And you abandon all but the first paragraph?

9 **MS. UHER:** Yes, Your Honor.

10 **THE COURT:** So, just to make sure the
11 defendant understands, Mr. Gonzalez, the only
12 allegation remaining is that you failed to notify the
13 supervision officer of any change in residence, to
14 wit; the defendant's last reported residence address
15 is 3306 Colley Street, Houston, Texas, 77093, and, in
16 fact, has never resided at the aforementioned
17 location as per resident, Lisa F. Apodaca. Thank
18 you.

19 The other allegations have been
20 abandoned. Thank you.

21 **MS. UHER:** With that, Your Honor, the
22 State would rest.

23 **THE COURT:** Thank you.

24 And let's just discuss the scheduling
25 off the record.
