24	A. Good morning. My name is Deputy Garcia. I

know, color of the person that's going to be the main focus of that line up.

- Q. So is your goal to collect how many other people to include in the line up?
- A. It's going to be the main focus plus four more, five more, depending on the investigator. Some people like to have six in the line up, some like to have five in the line up.
- Q. Once you get that information is it your job then to go around and collect people that all look similar to one another?
 - A. That's correct, ma'am.
- Q. What do you do with those people once you collect those people?
- A. Once I collect them I take them to my office at 49 San Jacinto and basically instruct them that, you know, they're just here for a line up. They have nothing to do with this case. It's a long process of walking. So I kind of tell them, you know, that -- like I said, has nothing to do with them. And are going to a cell block and pretty much have them waiting while the investigator shows up and, you know, does his thing. My job is basically just to get people down there, make sure that it's a fair line up and turn it over to the investigator.

 Q. So when you say a fair line up, what do you mean by that?

- A. A fair line up means that I'm not going to put a Hispanic male along with someone that's going to be darker or white male. If it's a six foot five male I'm going to put a six foot five male. If I can't find them I'll usually call the investigator and say, hey, it's not going to be a good line up. This guy is a little bit too tall in situations like that.
- Q. I want to turn your attention to the investigation in the case we're here on and the jury has convicted the defendant for, which is the aggravated robbery investigation arising from the robbery at the First Convenience Bank at Kroger.

At some point were you contacted by investigators with the FBI Bank Robbery Task Force?

- A. Yes, ma'am. I remember Sergeant Schobey, who works with the Harris County Sheriff's Office, and also is attached with the, you know, Federal Bank Unit. And he contacted me in regards to setting up a line up for a suspect for their main focus that was inside of one of the jails at the time.
- Q. Did you follow the procedure that you just described for us as far as attempting to collect that

person along with suitable fill-ins?

- A. Yes, ma'am. The first time I attempted I realized that he was at 701, which is one of the bigger jails. As soon as I pulled up the suspect's information or main focus information, I went directly to him, you know -- the first thing I do is I go through the information in the main focus of the procedure that's requested by an investigator and I carried on with that.
- Q. So when -- do you see the person that you are calling the main focus with respect to the line up you were trying to put together in the courtroom today?
 - A. Yes, ma'am.
 - Q. Can you tell us what he's wearing?
 - A. A white collared button down shirt.

MS. LOGAN: May the record reflect he's identified the defendant?

THE COURT: Record will so reflect.

- Q. (BY MS. LOGAN) Is that the person you went and visited in the 701 jail the first time you tried to put a line up together?
 - A. Yes, ma'am.
- Q. And at that time did you notify him that he was the main focus in an aggravated robbery?

Q. Later on did you attempt a second time to put a line up together for that case?

A. It was after the holidays. The first time was before the holidays. After the holidays I went back and I informed him that Sergeant Schobey had contacted his attorney and that we were going to proceed with the line up because that's what his defense attorney wanted to do.

- Q. So at that time what did you do next?
- A. We walked through a few of the cell blocks to go look for the fill-ins and he became uncomfortable and said, you know, I've got a free world attorney. You guys are trying to play games with me. Trying to set me up.
- Q. You said he became uncomfortable. Tell us what made you believe he was uncomfortable?
- A. Well, you know, he became uncomfortable by, of course, trying to ask a lot of questions, you know. Then once I started giving Sergeant Schobey's name and stuff like that he started cursing, started saying this is a bunch of BS. This is not going to happen. I've got a free world attorney. I don't have a court appointed attorney. He's one of those
 - Q. Would you consider he became unruly at that
