

1 (Witness sworn.)

2 THE COURT: Please have a seat.

3 Ms. Buese, you may proceed.

4 JASON GUILLEN

5 Having first been duly sworn, testified as follows:

6 DIRECT EXAMINATION

7 BY MS. BUESE:

8 Q. Sir, could you please introduce yourself?

9 A. My name is Jason Guillen. I work for the
10 Harris County Sheriff's Office. I've been a deputy for
11 13 years and assigned to hot spots.

12 Q. Where were you assigned?

13 A. District 3.

14 Q. When you were assigned, did you respond to a
15 call involving this defendant?

16 MR. HINTON: I object to any hearsay.

17 THE COURT: Just rephrase it.

18 Q. (By Ms. Buese) Did you respond to a call for
19 service at that time?

20 A. Yes, ma'am.

21 Q. And if you remember, what was the date of that
22 call?

23 A. It was December 21st.

24 Q. And what type of a call was it that you were
25 responding to?

1 A. It was --

2 MR. HINTON: I object if it involved any
3 hearsay.

4 THE COURT: Again without going into
5 hearsay, what did he see or do when he arrived?

6 Q. (By Ms. Buese) First of all, where did you go?

7 A. I went to an address on Avenue K in reference
8 to a drive-by shooting.

9 Q. Was that in Harris County, Texas?

10 A. Yes, ma'am, it was.

11 Q. When you got there, did you see the residence?

12 A. Yes, ma'am, I did.

13 Q. What, if anything, significant about the
14 residence did you observe?

15 A. I observed what I believe to be bullet holes on
16 the front of the residence.

17 Q. Did you ever make it inside of the residence?

18 A. Yes, ma'am. I did to check the welfare of the
19 residents inside the residence.

20 Q. Could you tell the jury who all was present
21 when you entered that residence?

22 A. I don't remember exactly. I observed there
23 were several adults and a small child.

24 Q. And when you say a small child, how old of a
25 child are we talking about?

1 A. I believe the baby was one, two tops.

2 Q. Was there a crib inside that residence?

3 A. Yes, ma'am, there was.

4 Q. And did you notice any bullet holes or bullet
5 strikes in proximity to that crib?

6 A. Yes, ma'am. I believe we pulled a projectile
7 out of the crib itself.

8 Q. And to your knowledge, was anybody ever charged
9 relating to your investigation?

10 A. Yes, ma'am.

11 Q. And was that case, when it came to court titled
12 Cause No. 1197383?

13 A. Yes, ma'am.

14 Q. And was the defendant charged in that case,
15 Alexandro Bravo?

16 A. Yes, ma'am.

17 Q. And if you know, was he actually convicted of
18 aggravated assault in that case?

19 A. I believe so.

20 MS. BUESE: Pass the witness.

21 THE COURT: Mr. Hinton.

22 MR. HINTON: No questions, Judge.

23 THE COURT: Deputy, thank you very much.

24 You are excused. Thank you. Your next witness.

25 MS. BUESE: The State calls Deputy

1 Squyres.

2 THE COURT: Deputy Squyres. Please come
3 right down here. Please raise your right hand to be
4 sworn in.

5 (Witness sworn.)

6 THE COURT: Please have a seat.

10 DIRECT EXAMINATION
