1 (Jury enters courtroom) 2 THE COURT: Good morning. Please be 3 It's nice to see your faces. seated. 4 State, you may continue. 5 MR. BALDASSANO: Thanks, Judge. 6 ANTHONY JANKE, 7 having been first duly sworn, testified as follows: 8 DIRECT EXAMINATION 9 BY MR. BALDASSANO: 10 Q. Just for the record, you're the same 11 Firefighter Janke that was testifying yesterday when we 12 broke for the day? 13 Α. Yes, sir. 14 And I think you had mentioned earlier yesterday 15 that you're the one who was in the -- doing search and 16 rescue and went into the room and found the defendant, whom you identified yesterday; is that right? 17 Yes, sir. 18 Α. 19 You spoke about having a temperature gauge or 20 a -- what was the name of the device you used? 21 The thermal imaging camera. A . 22 Q. Okay. Thermal imaging camera. And I think you 23 said yesterday it's about 150 degrees, something like 24 that? 25 A. 150, 165, something like that. Nothing

remarkable. 1 Is that the kind of temperature that would 2 3 cause a burn on a body? 4 Not really, no, sir. A . 5 Okay. Would that be the kind of burn that Q. 6 temperature would cause singing of your hair? 7 I don't think it would, no, sir. Not that I --8 0. Okay. And I think you described it as a fairly 9 small office, and I think you were in the process of 10 maybe giving us an example of how big the office is. 11 Using the courtroom or the jury box, how big would you 12 say that office was? 13 Α. I'd say possibly as long as the jury box, maybe a little longer, and twice as wide maybe. 14 15 MR. BALDASSANO: May I approach the court 16 reporter, Judge? 17 THE COURT: You may. 18 MR. BALDASSANO: I'm going to go ahead and 19 put that picture back up. 20 Q. (By Mr. Baldassano) Okay. And I believe you 21 said the smoke banked down from the ceiling to about three feet off the ground; is that right? 22 23 Yes, sir, that's correct. Α. 24 Okay. And this is the little room we were Q. 25 talking about, right?

A. Yes, sir.

- Q. Okay. And I think you said yesterday you saw some feet on the ground, and then you told other firefighters you see somebody?
- A. Yes, sir. As I was standing there with the thermal imaging camera, I was looking at the atmosphere, checking temperature in the atmosphere. And then I was checking further towards the back of the -- back of the office towards the left.

And as I came down, I looked. And underneath the smoke -- I didn't need the TIC to find the body. I could see the feet without having to use the thermal imaging camera.

- Q. And from where you were in that room, did you see any kind of flame, or fire, or anything like it?
  - A. No, sir.
- Q. And would the -- I think you said the Fire Company 28?
  - A. Ladder 28.
- Q. They broke the door. How about that door we're looking at on State's 14? Was that open, closed? Do you remember?
- A. I don't recall. It was dark and a lot of smoke, and we didn't go that far in. As soon as we found the victim on the floor, we came out of the room

1 and brought him outside.

- Q. Okay. And you're talking about the defendant?
- A. Yes, sir.

- Q. And when you brought him outside, did you physically pick him up?
- A. I did not. My two firefighters that were on the pumper with me picked him up and carried him out.
- Q. All right. And then when he was outside, did you do any first aid on him or watch anybody do first aid?
- A. We assisted the Medic Unit in loading him onto the stretcher to put him in the back of the ambulance.
- Q. Okay. And, so, other than that, did you see anybody do any first aid, CPR, or something like that?
- A. No, sir. All they did was put oxygen on him before they put him in the back of the ambulance.
- Q. Okay. And then they close him up and go, or do you see anything else?
- A. I didn't see anything else. They closed the doors, and the paramedics climbed in and they started doing their thing.
  - Q. Did you have any other contact with him after that point?
    - A. No, sir, I did not.
- Q. And after you -- he left, did you stay at the

scene or go around the back to look at the fire, or do anything else regarding the fire?

- A. After they left, after we left him in the care of the Medic Unit, we continued our search.
- Q. All right. What did you do to continue your search?
- A. We went into the next buildings and continued searching for victims to make sure that the buildings were clear.
- Q. Okay. This is State's Exhibit No. 1 here.

  It's similar to the big board. And can you just

  point -- press on the screen and just tell us, without

  going into all the detail, which units did you check to

  make sure there were no people inside?
- A. We looked through this one here. Then we were about to enter, I think it was this one, when Ladder 28 said they had already checked it. So we continued through and wound up in the back, back here.
- Q. Okay. And did you find anybody else in the building other than the defendant?
  - A. No, sir. Nobody else was in the building.
- Q. All right. And did any other firefighters that were working with you, 28 or anybody else, find anybody else in the building for this search part that you were doing?

No, sir. To my knowledge, we were the only 1 Α. 2 ones that brought anybody out. 3 Q. All right. And then what did you do after the 4 search of the entire building? 5 A. We just -- we hooked up with the rest of the 6 crews back here and just, you know, talked about what we 7 found, what we saw; and then we were relieved after we did overhaul. 8 9 What is overhaul? Q. 10 Overhaul is when you're checking to make sure A. 11 there is no fire extension and all the fire is out. 12 Q. So you kind of move things around and douse it 13 with water? 14 A. Yes, sir. 15 MR. BALDASSANO: I'll pass the witness. 16 THE COURT: Okay. Your cross. 17 MR. BARROW: Thank you, Judge. 18 CROSS-EXAMINATION 19 BY MR. BARROW: 20 Q. Mr. Janke --21 Α. Janke. 22 0. Janke. I'm sorry. What condition was 23 Mr. Morin in? 24 A. He was unconscious, unresponsive. 25 MR. BARROW: Pass the witness.

- Q. And when you say he was unresponsive, do you try to talk to him, or how do you gauge that?
- A. Yes, sir. We hollered at him, kind of shook him a little bit, trying to get him to open his eyes to know that we were there. And the firefighters told me they got -- they did not get any response from him.
- Q. Okay. So the two things that you do, part of your procedure, is to yell or holler at him and shake him?
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. And then if a person doesn't respond to that, you pretty much think they're unresponsive and --
- A. Well, when we're not in full bunker gear with thick gloves, there's other things you can do. You can mash the nail bed, push down on the eyebrows to find out if they're just faking or if they really are unresponsive.
  - Q. Have you ever seen anybody faking?
- A. I've seen them fake unresponsiveness. But once you start smashing on the eyebrow or pushing on the nail bed, they decide it's no longer time to fake.
  - Q. All right. And was that done?
- A. No, not with us, because the gloves prevented
