1 of your presence. 2 You may proceed. 3 CALVIN JOHNSON, having been first duly sworn, testified as follows: 4 DIRECT EXAMINATION 5 6 BY MS. VOLLMAN 7 Can you please introduce yourself to the jury 8 by telling them your name and where you work? 9 \boldsymbol{A} Okay. I'm Calvin Johnson. I am employed here 10 at the Harris County District Attorney's office as an investigator. 11 12 Can you tell us what job you do at the DA's office? 13 14 \boldsymbol{A} I'm assigned to the white collar section of the special crimes bureau. I investigate cases, white color 15 16 crimes. Also I do technical support. Technical support deals with cameras, making copies of evidence and so on, 17 so forth. And I also do some digital forensics with 18 19 cell phones. 20 How long have you worked for the District Attorney's office? 21 22 I've been with the DA's office for 12 years 23 now. 24 Can you tell the jury briefly a little bit about your background that qualifies you to do the work

25

you do?

A Well, my background starts 22 years. I was with Houston Police Department for 22 years as an investigator there. I had some technical support type classes there at HPD. And since coming to the District Attorney's office, I've also been to national. I'm a member of National Technical Investigations Association, which we have schools every year to keep us up on the change in technology that we have here.

Q Is it fair to say that the technology is constantly changing?

A It changes almost daily. It changes, technology.

Q Okay. At some point in time were you asked to assist in the video recording of depositions in this case?

A Yes, ma'am, I was.

Q Can you describe what you did, just generally?

A Generally what we did is we set up two cameras, one a backup in case something happened to the first one. And we centered the cameras towards the Judge and toward the person who was being -- the witness who was on the stand.

Q Okay. Was there a district judge sitting on the Bench presiding over the deposition?

A Yes, ma'am, there were.

- Q And can you tell us who else you saw in the courtroom? And just so we're clear, it wasn't this Judge. Do you know which judges were sitting on the Bench at the time?
- A It would have been Judge Stricklin. There are two Judge Strickles, male and female. Be one of those two. Along with the Judges Stricklin, it would have been the prosecutor and whoever may have been assisting the prosecutor. You would have had the defense attorney and their clients. And on most of the occasions there were several defense attorneys and their clients in the courtroom. And of course the witness who is testifying in the case at that time.
- Q And were all the witnesses Medicaid recipients, caregivers or guardians?
 - A Yes, ma'am, they were.
- Q And were they all testifying as to whether or not they got supplies from the companies involved in this case?
 - A Yes, ma'am. That would be correct.
- Q Let me show you --
- 23 MS. VOLLMAN: Judge, may I approach?

 THE COURT: You may.
 - Q (By Ms. Vollman) Let me show you what has been

marked State's Exhibit Numbers 728, 729, 730, 731, and 732. Can you identify those disks?

A These two are disks that I made during the depositions.

Q Okay.

A And I can identify them because I will usually put the copy, what it was, the date, which camera it came from, and I put all big "C" for Calvin. And everybody knows me as Calvin, so that's how I sign my signature.

Q Okay. What about the other three?

A The others were made by another investigator and I recognize these as, would be Gary Johnson.

Q Okay. And did you -- were you the one filming these on these three particular days?

A No. I only filmed the two here that I have right here, which would be Exhibit 729 and 730 are mine.

Q Okay. And if you -- have you had a chance on 729 and 730 to review all the depositions that were taken on those days?

A I take that back. These are mine. It's got "Calvin". I normally sign it with a C but this has got Cal J. So Cal J would be mine also.

Q Okay. So all these are yours?

A Yes, ma'am. They all are.

Okay. Now, you -- you took all these. Can you 0 1 2 tell us, were these depositions videotaped on a 3 recording device capable of making an accurate recording? 4 5 A Yes, ma'am. They were taken with a Sony. 6 only have Sony cameras in the office. So it was taken 7 with a Sony camera. 8 Q Were you trained and competent to operate the 9 video recorder that you used to record these videotapes? 10 Yes, ma'am. I can operate a camera. And are these recordings an accurate copy of 11 12 the depositions that took place in this case and that were downloaded onto the disk? 13 14 \boldsymbol{A} Yes, ma'am. 15 Have the recordings been altered in any manner? 0 16 A No. Were the voices that would be reflected on each 17 one of these disks the voice of the defense attorney, 18 19 the defendant, the prosecutor, and assistant assisting 20 the prosecutor, the Judge, and the Medicaid witness recipient, quardian, or caretaker? 21 22 Α Yes, ma'am. That would be correct. 23 Now, can you tell us from the dates when these
