 - A. Single cell. It has a sole occupant of that cell.
 - Q. Do you remember or recall where the pieces of metal were found in that cell?
 - A. It was found in the southeast corner.
 - Q. Okay. Was it under a mattress, under a bunk or --
 - A. In the corner -- the metal bunk has another piece of angle iron, heavier type metal, and it's maybe not even an inch clearance around the wall the way it's installed into the building into the cell. So Detention Officer Allen had to put his head up against the wall and look down to be able to see the piece of metal. It was well hidden.
 - O. And after you found -- or after you and

- Detention Officer Allen found the shanks -- the pieces of metal, what steps did you take?
 - A. Detention Officer Allen held on to them and he passed them on to another sergeant and they were placed in the property.
