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- Q. How did you come into contact with him?
- A. On that particular morning, I think it was about 3:30 in the morning, we were patrolling the parking lot of Hottyz Nightclub at the 9800 block of Westpark.
 - Q. Is that in Harris County, Texas?
 - A. Yes, ma'am. As we were pulling into the parking lot, I was flagged down by a young black male about 25 years of age who told us that somebody had just threatened to kill him and pointed a gun at him.
- 12 Q. What did you do with that information?
- A. At that point, we asked him who the person was.
- 14 My partner and I asked that individual who the person was.
- 15 And he pointed directly at who I now know to be Patrick
- 16 Sowells, and identified him as the individual.
- 17 Q. Do you see Patrick Sowells in the courtroom today?
- 19 A. Yes, ma'am.
- Q. Would you please identify him by an article of clothing he's wearing?
- A. The gentleman over here in the jumpsuit, the orange.
- THE COURT: He's identified the defendant.
- Q. (By Ms. Mitchell) And, so, once you identified

Mr. Sowells, what did you do?

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- A. At that point, believing that he may have a firearm as described, my partner and I exited our patrol vehicle with our weapons drawn and approached him asking him to stop, because at that point he had been backing into a parking space in his vehicle. And his vehicle had begun to roll forward. And we believed that -- it appeared to us at that point that he may be trying to drive away as we were approaching him on the right.
 - Q. Okay. Then what happened?
- 11 At that point, we told him to stop again, Α. pointed our weapons at him because we believed he was 12 13 being aggressive in the way that he was acting. He turned the key off to his vehicle. While it was still in gear, 14 15 he let it roll because the parking lot is kind of a hill. 16 He let it continue to roll. And he put his hands up 17 acting like he couldn't stop the vehicle. At that point, 18 Armand, my partner, placed Mr. Sowells in custody. And I 19 had another individual approaching the vehicle at that time, and I dealt with the other individual. 20
 - Q. At any point, did you search for a weapon?
 - A. Yes, of course. Yes, ma'am.
- Q. And were you able to locate a weapon?
- A. Yes, ma'am.
- Q. Where did you find that weapon?

- A. Like I said, when we were approaching the scene, Mr. Sowells had been backing his Chrysler into a parking spot, and that obstructed our vehicle because there was another vehicle next to him. When I searched the area, I actually found a pistol underneath the car -- partially underneath that car that he had been backing in
- Q. Okay. Was it in a place where -- I guess where the defendant could have reached or thrown the gun?
- 10 A. Yes, ma'am.
