What facility is at 1200 Baker Street? 12 Q. 13 The detention facility. Α. And what are your duties as a detention officer 14 Q. at that facility? 15 To control and maintain the inmates. 16 Α. 17 Q. And were you working there on May 4, 2012? Yes. 18 Α. 19 Q. Now Officer McClain, how long have you worked 20 there? A little over five year. 21 Α. 22 Q. And where were you posted when you were there on May 4, 2012? 23 I was in F Pod 2F. 24 Α. 25 And were you wearing a uniform when you were in Q.

   tell me where are you posted in this cell block?
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- 1 A. Right here in this approximate area.
  - Q. And Officer McClain, what are these things separating, these separations here?
  - A. This is the vestibule and this is the brick wall.
  - Q. Officer McClain, if you could press a little harder when you press on this.
  - A. I'm sorry. This is the vestibule and this is the brick walls for each side of the cell blocks.
  - Q. And can you clear the screen for us. Now Officer McClain, what is this area here?
    - A. That's the day room.
    - Q. And what are these spaces here?
- 14 A. These are the cell blocks.
- Q. And what are the rectangular objects?
- 16 A. Those are the beds.

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- Q. And Officer McClain, I'm showing you what's marked as State's Exhibit 2. What is this?
- A. That is a picture of the inside of the pods looking in the 2F.
- Q. And when you say inside of the pod, can you show us on the screen where the pod is.
  - A. The pod is right there. (Indicating.)
- Q. Does this fairly and accurately represent what it depicts?

Α. Yes. 1 2 MR. JOSH HILL: No objection. THE COURT: Admitted. 3 MR. BERNARD: May we published to the 4 5 jury. THE COURT: You may. 6 (By Mr. Bernard) Officer McClain, I'm showing 7 you next State's Exhibit 1. Officer McClain, could you 8 clear the scene for us? 10 Α. (Complying.) Now Officer McClain, could you show us on 11 State's Exhibit 1, the layout, could you just draw a 12 13 line that shows the view that we have here on State's Exhibit 2. 14 15 Α. You mean from the inside of the pod to Inmate Graves, where he was housed, where his bunk was. 16 I mean looking on State's Exhibit 2 there, 17 there's a certain view that you have and could you draw 18 19 a line showing -- could you just put a dot on the cell where Station 2 is viewed. 20 (Indicating.) 21 Α. And could you show us where that is on State's 22 Exhibit 1. 23 (Indicating.) 24 Α.

Officer McClain, what is the morning routine --

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Q.

- what happens in the morning in that pod on a routine day?
  - A. We do shifts, we do shift change, and then anything that happened prior gets passed down. It's like a briefing. And then I start my day by filling out that paperwork, hand out the log, pass on books, handle the inmate cards.
    - Q. And when did your shift start on May 4, 2012?
    - A. 6:00 o'clock.

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- Q. What is the routine for the jail after 6:00, what happens there in the F Pod?
- A. 6:00 o'clock is when the shift starts. And we don't wake the inmates up until 7:00 o'clock.
- Q. And what happens at 7:00 o'clock when you wake up the inmates?
- A. At 7:00, that's when I call into the cell block by the intercom and I wake all the inmates up.
- Q. On May 4, 2012, how quickly do the inmates get up?
  - A. They take their time.
- Q. And on May 4, 2012, what routine did you follow or did you wake the inmates up on May 4, 2012?
  - A. Yes.
- Q. How did you do that?
- 25 A. By intercom.

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When was that?
       Q.
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- 7:00 o'clock.
- And did anything unusual happen on May 4, 2012 3 when you -- after you called over the intercom to wake 4 5 the inmates up?
  - I seen an inmate, an unidentified inmate in C I'm seeing in C Cell. He was masturbating. just say that, because that's what he was doing.
    - And what was he wearing? Q.
- 10 He was just wearing boxers.
- 11 Ο. And did -- let's see -- was any part of his 12 body exposed?
- 13 Α. Yes.
- What parts of his body was exposed? Q. 14
- 15 He had his penis out. Α.
- 16 Ο. And were his boxers covering his penis?
- 17 Α. No. His penis was over the front part of the
- boxers. 18

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- Q. And what was he doing?
- He was doing this motion. (Indicating.) 20 Α.
- And what did you do next? 21 Q.
- I then called the FCC and I told the deputies 22 Α.
- 23 in FCC that I had an inmate that was masturbating so
- could you get some rovers over here.
- 25 Q. What's the FCC?

1 A. That's a 4F.

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- Q. Where's that located?
- A. That's located in the front by the elevator lobby.
  - O. And what are rovers?
- A. Rovers are the men and women that rove the floor to help deal with inmates, and help with problem inmates, I'll say that.
  - Q. When you saw the inmate in Cell C masturbating, where was the inmate standing?
- A. (Indicating.)
- Q. Could you clear the screen for us?
- A. Oh, I'm sorry.
- Q. Could you show us on Exhibit 1 where the inmate was standing?
- A. He was inside C Cell right here because he had a top bunk.
- Q. And was he in the bunk or --
- A. No, he was outside the bunk. He was standing beside it.
- Q. And could you show us on Exhibit 2 where he was standing?
- A. Because this would be his bunk right here. The top one, and he was standing besides the bunk.
- Q. Is there -- aside from the bed, was there any

other furniture or anything like that in Cell C?

A. The toilet.

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- O. Where is the toilet?
- A. Behind this wall. It's behind this wall.
- Q. Could you show us on Exhibit 1 where the toilet is in Cell C?
  - A. Right here under this corner.
- Q. Now, how much time have you spent working as a detention officer in F Pod before this happened?
- A. I rotated, I had actually three different pods that I worked, so I had rotated between three different pods and F pod was one of my pods.
- Q. And how many days a week would you work at F pod?
  - A. I would say maybe two to three days a week.
- Q. And for how long were you on rotation working two to three days a week in F pod?
  - A. Probably about maybe a couple of months.
- Q. And during this time, where do inmates stand or sit when they were using the toilets in C Cell?
- MR. JOSH HILL: Judge, I'm going to object to what inmates do.
- THE COURT: Overruled.
- Q. (By Mr. Bernard) You may answer.
- A. When they use the restroom, they use it in the

corner part of it.

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- Q. Could you clear the screen for us. Could you show us on Exhibit 2 where they stand, understanding they are inside the wall there.
  - A. It's there where they are standing.
  - Q. Where they use the toilet?
- A. It would still be behind this wall. I really can't see them, but it's behind this wall.
- Q. Okay. And could you just show us again on Exhibit 1 where that is?
- A. (Indicating.)
  - Q. And where was the inmate who was masturbating?
- A. Which one?
- 14 Q. On Exhibit 1?
  - A. On Exhibit 1, right here.
- Q. And where was the inmate when he was masturbating? Can you show us on Exhibit 2.
- A. Right here in this area because that's his top bunk right there.
- Q. And could you show us with a line on Exhibit 1, which way do -- which way do inmates face when they use the toilet?
- A. They face? I really can't see when they're using the restroom, so they could stand any way but I really can't see them.

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Q. And which way was the inmate who was masturbating facing?
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- A. He was facing --
- Q. Can you just draw a line on Exhibit 1 where he was facing?
- A. There.

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- Q. Outward. And now, were you able to see the front of his body when he was standing there?
  - A. Yes.
- Q. And were you able to see his face?
- 11 A. Yes.
- Q. And where was he looking?
- A. He was looking directly at me.
- Q. And do you recall whether his penis was erect or placid when this was happening?
- 16 A. It was erect.
- Q. And was he doing any bodily -- anything with his penis other than masturbating?
- 19 A. No, that was it, masturbating.
- Q. On the basis on your experience, before going to the detention officers facility, why do men
- 22 masturbate?
- MR. JOSH HILL: Judge, I'm going to object to speculation.
- THE COURT: Sustained.

Q. (By Mr. Bernard) Were there others in the cell block at the time?

A. Yes.

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- Q. Where were they?
  - A. They were sleeping.
- Q. Where were they sleeping?
- A. In their bunks.
- Q. And was anyone else in there other than the inmate who was masturbating and the inmates who were sleeping in their bunks? Was there anyone else in C?
- A. Yes, there were other inmates in C, but he was the only one up at the time.
  - Q. And what happened after you called the rovers?
  - A. After I called for the rovers, then they came and I opened up the door and let them in to the cell block so they could escort Inmate Graves out.
- Q. Could you show us on Exhibit 1 where those doors are?
  - A. This is the outer door, that little -- that black line, and this is the inner cell block door.
- Q. Officer McClain, I'm showing you what is marked as State's Exhibit 5, what is this?
  - A. That's the inner cell block door.
- Q. Could you clear the screen. And could you show us what the angle of view is, shown in this exhibit?

In that one, shows F pod. Α. 1 2 Q. Yes. This is from the pod here, from this window 3 right here. 4 Does this fairly and accurately represent what 5 it depicts? 6 Yes. 7 Α. MR. JOSH HILL: No objection. 8 THE COURT: Admitted. 9 10 MR. BERNARD: May we published? THE COURT: Yes. 11 (By Mr. Bernard) Deputy McClain, could you 12 Q. 13 point out, show the jury again on State's Exhibit 1, where the inner door is? 14 A. (Indicating.) 15 16 And could you show us on State's Exhibit 2 where that door is, where the inner door is? Clear the 17 screen please. 18 19 Α. (Complying.) How does that inner door function? 20 By the control panel. You have to turn a lock 21 to open it. 22 Where is that control panel? 23 Q. Right here. 24 Α.

    - A. No. I control the doors.
    - Q. And how do you know when they want to enter?
    - A. I can see them.

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- Q. When they enter, when the deputies want to enter the cell block?
- A. I am sitting down in the office and I can look
  the at the screen. I can open up one side or close one
  side.
- Q. And where are they when they do that?
- A. Sometimes they could be either in the hallway.
- Q. Will you show us the hallway you're talking about on Exhibit 1?
- A. Yes. This is the hallway right here before you go into the cell blocks.
- Q. Could you clear the screen for us. On May 4,
  21 2012, when you called for the rovers after seeing the
  22 inmate masturbating, what happens?
- A. The two deputies, they get there, they went into C, and they escorted Inmate Graves out.
- Q. And where did they enter?

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A. They entered through the outer door and then into the inner door.
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- Q. And before they came to the outer door, where were they?
- A. They were in the hallway. I seen them walking down the hallway.
- Q. And then what happened as you saw them walking down the hallway?
- A. I waited until they got a little bit closer. I saw them at the outer door because if I opened the outer door too soon, then they can hear it, the inmates can hear it.
- Q. And after that, did you open the outer door?
- A. When they got closer, yes.
  - Q. And what did they do?
  - A. They entered through the outer door.
- Q. And what happened next?
- A. I opened the inner door so they could enter to the day room area?
  - Q. Did you do anything before you opened the inner door?
    - A. Closed off the outer door.
- Q. And were both doors opened when the deputies went in?
- 25 A. No.

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Q. Why not?

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- A. Because you have to close one door before you could open up the other.
- Q. And after you closed the outer door and opened the inner door, where did the deputies go?
- A. Well, when they entered, Deputy Harden looked at me and he was like where. He didn't say it out loud. It was like a gesture. And I just said, that means C. (Indicating.)
- Q. And where did the two deputies -- excuse me -- could you clear the screen for us?
- A. (Complies.)
- Q. How many deputies were there?
- 14 A. There were two.
- Q. And who were they?
- 16 A. Deputy Harden and Deputy Jones.
- Q. And where were they when you communicated with
  Deputy Harden, when you made the gesture, the C gesture
  to Deputy Harden?
  - A. They just entered the inside. They just came in through the door.
  - Q. And what happened after that?
- A. Then they walked over to the C Cell and that's when they saw Inmate Graves.
  - Q. Can you show me where they were standing at

when they approached C Cell?

- A. A, B, C. They were outside C.
- Q. And when the outer door opened, when you were letting the two rovers in, did it make a sound?
  - A. Yes, it made a loud sound.
  - Q. Was that sound audible to you?
  - A. Yes.
- Q. And was that the normal sound that is usually made?
- 10 A. Yeah, it's a normal sound.
- Q. And after the deputies entered -- excuse me.

  What happened after you opened the outer door? What
- 13 happened inside the pod after you opened the outer
- 14 door?

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- 15 A. When they were already in there?
- Q. Just after you opened the outer door, what happened?
- A. Well, I opened the outer door and I let them in and I opened the inner door and that's when they walked over to C Cell, and that's when they went to Inmate Graves.
- Q. Now, when you're in the pod there, on duty,
- 23 what are your duties in actually standing there or
- 24 sitting in the pod?
- A. Well, we have command, I usually stand so I can

control the crowd, you know, if anything else may happen or whatever.

- Q. And where are you located when you are standing to see if anything else is happening.
  - A. I follow them. My eyes follow them.
  - Q. And who are they?

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- A. Deputy Harden and Deputy Jones.
- Q. Deputy Harden and Deputy Jones. And when you're on duty, when there isn't anything going on, what is your job, what is the purpose of having you there in the pod?
- A. To make sure no fights break out and we have a lot of in and out movement too.
  - Q. How do you make sure no fights break out?
  - A. Well, I can't, you know, make sure but if fights break out, I can call for rovers to handle the situation.
    - Q. How do you know if any fights break out?
    - A. When you actually see them fighting.
- Q. All right. What do you have to do to see whether or not people are fighting?
- 22 A. Well, when the fight breaks out, it's visible.
- I call for rovers and rovers come and I let them in the same way.
  - Q. And when you're just part of your regular

1 routine there in the pod, where are you? What do you do
2 with your head? Where are you looking, inside the pod
3 or outside the pod?

- A. Well, there's two sides, so I got to make rounds visually of both sides?
- Q. Do they require you to do these visual rounds both sides?
  - A. Yes.

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- Q. Do you have any alternatives, given your duties, other than looking around?
- A. I mean, sometimes the medication, triage, inmates going to the clinic. I mean just a lot of different events there.
- Q. What are these events that you're describing?
  - A. One of the things, the daily routines.
- Q. Okay. When this inmate was looking at you from C Pod and masturbating, were his eyes opened or closed?
- 18 A. They were opened.
  - Q. And did he make eye contact with you?
- 20 A. Yes.
- Q. And after he made eye contact with you, what happened?
- 23 A. I turned away.
- Q. And how long was this eye contact between the two of you?

- It was probably like seconds. Α.
- And after the two deputies arrived and they took the inmate into his cell -- when they arrived, were there any other inmates in Cell C when they got there?
  - Α. Yes.

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- Q. And where were those inmates?
- They were still in their bunks.
- And did any inmates get out of their bunk when you called for the rovers and the rovers arrived?
- Not that I'm aware of. He was the only one awake at that time.
- And did you see -- after you opened the outer 12 0. 13 cell door, did you see anybody get up in that cell?
- 14 Α. No.
  - And was the inmate who they took out of that Q. cell the same inmate who was masturbating?
- 17 Α. Yes.
- And what happened -- where did they go after 18 19 they escorted him out?
- 20 They escorted him out of the cell block. They took him into the hallway. 21
- Did you ever ask any of the inmates to 22
- masturbate?
- No, I didn't. 24 Α.
- 25 Did you ever ask any inmates to look at you Q.
