Graduated from the Police Academy? Yes, ma'am. 20 Α. 21 Q. And are you a certified peace officer? 22 Yes, ma'am. Α. 23 Back in November of 2011, were you a Q. patrol officer in Southeast Patrol? 24

And I want to take your attention 15 specifically to November the 2nd of 2011. Were you 16 riding with Officer Gilbert on that date? 17 Α. Yes, ma'am. 18 And do you recall checking by a location 19 to assist with an investigation? 20 Α. Yes, ma'am. 21 Q. Where did you go? 22 We went to, I believe it was, the 11000 Α. 23 block of Martin Luther King Boulevard.

- Q. And after making contact with Officer

 Hutson, did you receive information that led you to
 go to a secondary location?
- A. Yes. Originally we were looking for spent shell casings around the 11000 block of MLK. We drove up and down from 11000 MLK to 12000 MLK looking for spent shell casings. We were not able to find any at that time.
- Q. So what led you to go -- you're not finding any spent shell casings at that location. What led you to go to a second location?
- A. We returned to the scene where we originally checked by with Officer Hutson. Officer Hutson had contacted the manager of Domino's Pizza at the time. The nearest -- the nearest order to where we were at was located at, I believe it was, 5430 Madden. And so we decided -- we volunteered to check by at that location to see if anything was -- anything had happened at that point.

Yes, ma'am. 7 And tell the jury what that means. 0. 8 did you do? 9 We were looking for spent shell casings 10 just like we were on Martin Luther King Boulevard. 11 When we pulled up to the actual address, we saw a 12 spent shell casing in the driveway of 5430 Madden. 13 At that point we started walking through the area. 14 My partner took -- I believe he was walking along 15 the sidewalk by the houses and I took the streets. 16 Shortly after we found the first spent 17 shell casing on the driveway, I found another shell 18 casing in the middle of the street. 19 Explain to the jury or describe if you 20 can the sort of lighting that you were working with out there. 21 22 It was pretty poor lighting. Α. It was

late in the evening, around, I think it was, like,

- Q. And where did that come from?
- A. While we were out there, we had originally put little pieces of paper to mark where the shell casings were found. While we were waiting for the Crime Scent Unit and Homicide to make it to our location, it began to rain and wind very heavily. So we tried to find a way to maintain the location of the shell casings, and so we found a roll of duct tape in our trunk. We put that around on the street, and then I monitored the one in the driveway. We didn't have anything else to protect that one.
 - Q. So you find two shell casings out there, and then you've got weather affecting -- affecting their positioning, correct?
 - A. Yes, ma'am.
 - Q. Is it possible that there were any other shell casings out there that you didn't initially observe that the weather could have affected those and moved them?
 - A. Yes, ma'am.

- Q. Now, did you collect that evidence or did you -- did you leave somebody else with that responsibility?
 - A. I left that with the Crime Scent Unit.
 - Q. Do you recall which Crime Scene officer came to the scene?
 - A. I don't recall, ma'am.
 - Q. Okay. That's fine.

Other than what you've described to us up to this point, did you take any other active role in this investigation?

- A. While we were out there, there was a group of -- I guess they were neighbors that gathered outside. My partner went and got their information and recorded that. I got a brief statement. I believe I recorded that in my report.
- Q. And in talking with those neighbors, were you able to determine whether there had been an eyewitness to the shooting?
- A. If I remember correctly, no one had witnessed anything, but they had heard gunshots in the area close by.
- Q. So up to that point did you have any evidentiary leads other than those two shell casings?

 - Q. Okay. When it started raining, I mean, what did you guys do?
 - A. When it started raining, we contacted our sergeant first to ask him how we should preserve the evidence, and that was Sergeant Figueroa. He said try to find anything, like a cup or anything with a circle type shape to -- to contain the evidence.
 - Q. To hold it in place?
- A. Yes, sir. All we were able to find was
 the duct tape so we put the duct tape around the one
 in the street. The one on the driveway we didn't

have any way of containing that area. 1 2 But you said you continued to monitor 3 I assume that means to watch it? Yes, sir. We pulled our police car back 4 5 next to the houses on that side of the street, and 6 we shined our light on that area to make sure no one 7 entered or exited that area. We could -- we could 8 see the duct tape, and we were trying to monitor where the shell casing on the driveway was. 9 10 Q. Okay. 11 MR. CORNELIUS: Pass the witness. 12 MS. MAGNESS: No further questions, 1.3 Judge. 14 THE COURT: May this witness be 15 excused? 16 MS. MAGNESS: Yes, sir. 17 MR. CORNELIUS: Yes. 18 THE COURT: All right. You may step down. You're excused. Thank you, Officer. 19 20 All right. Ladies and gentlemen of 21 the jury, that's all the witnesses that we have for 22 you today. 2.3 Tomorrow morning if you can be back 24 in the jury room by 10:00 o'clock. We'll get
