

1 ROBERT TORRES,
2 having been first duly sworn, testified as follows:

3 DIRECT EXAMINATION

4 Q. (BY MS. ONCKEN) Good morning.

5 A. Good morning.

6 Q. How are you today?

7 A. I'm fine. And you?

8 Q. Welcome back. Are you the same Sergeant
9 Robert Torres who testified in the case yesterday?

10 A. Yes, I am.

11 Q. Okay. And you understand that you are
12 still under oath?

13 A. I do, yes.

14 MS. ONCKEN: And may I approach the
15 witness?

16 THE COURT: Yes, ma'am.

17 Q. (BY MS. ONCKEN) I'm going to show you
18 what's been marked as State's Exhibit Number 99-A-1
19 and ask if you have had an opportunity to view that
20 here in court this morning?

21 A. Yes, I have.

22 Q. Okay. And I think we were all present
23 yesterday when we had some technical problems with
24 State's 99-A; is that correct?

25 A. Yes.

1 Q. And did 99-A that was offered yesterday,
2 was it defective?

3 A. It was. It was stopping.

4 Q. It was stopping?

5 A. Uh-huh.

6 Q. Okay. And State's Exhibit 99-A-1, is that
7 an exact duplicate of 99-A?

8 A. Yes, without the defect.

9 Q. Without the defect. Okay. Well, I guess
10 I'll ask like I did yesterday. Is 99-A-1 a true and
11 correct copy of not only 99-A but the original
12 statement that you took from the defendant on March
13 31st, 2010, save any additions or deletions as
14 required by the Court?

15 A. Yes, it is.

16 MS. ONCKEN: Okay. Offer 99-A-1 and
17 tender to counsel for any objection.

18 MR. MARTIN: We have no objection to
19 this, Judge. We saw the glitches yesterday.

20 THE COURT: Okay. Being no objection,
21 State's 99-A-1 will be admitted.

22 MS. ONCKEN: Pass the witness.

23 MR. MARTIN: I have no questions of
24 this sergeant.
