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**VIET VU,**

having been first duly sworn, testified as follows:

**DIRECT EXAMINATION**

**BY MS. HARVEY:**

Q. Would you tell the jury what your name is?

A. My name is Viet Vu. First name Viet, V-i-e-t;  
last name Vu, V-u.

Q. How are you employed?

A. I'm employed with the sheriff's office for  
approximately 14 years.

Q. And what are your duties with the sheriff's  
department?

A. I was in Crime Scene Unit for about six years,  
but now I work in detention center at operations.

Q. Back on March 20th of 2011, did you have  
occasion to come into contact with the defendant in this  
case, Jackie Dinanno?

A. Yes, ma'am.

Q. And specifically for what purpose did you come  
into contact with her?

A. I was a secondary officer. On the weekend, we  
usually have about three or four people on-call. And  
the supervisor got called up to go to -- to have a photo  
up at the hospital. That's how I met with the  
defendant.

1 Q. When you met with the defendant, were her hands  
2 in brown bags?

3 A. Yes, ma'am.

4 Q. Did you remove those bags?

5 A. Yes, ma'am.

6 Q. And for what purpose did you remove the bags on  
7 her hands?

8 A. I removed the bags so I can conduct a gunshot  
9 residue.

10 Q. And did you, in fact, conduct a gunshot residue  
11 collection on her?

12 A. Yes, ma'am, I did.

13 Q. And how is that done?

14 A. It came in a packet with about three vials.  
15 And at the end of the cap, they have a sticky, you know,  
16 just like sticking tape. And all I do is just do one on  
17 her right hand, one on her left hand, and the control  
18 is -- I did it on myself.

19 MS. HARVEY: May I approach, Your Honor?

20 THE COURT: You may.

21 Q. (By Ms. Harvey) Okay. I'm showing you a brown  
22 bag from which you just watched me take a white bag out  
23 of the brown bag.

24 A. Yes, ma'am.

25 Q. The brown bag is not marked. The white bag is

1 marked. It's marked as State's Exhibit 110.

2 A. Yes, ma'am.

3 Q. Do you recognize the brown bag?

4 A. Yes, ma'am. Because the label barcode and my  
5 initial on the tape.

6 Q. Okay. And do you recognize the white bag?

7 A. Yes, ma'am.

8 Q. And is this, in fact, the gunshot residue  
9 evidence collection kit that you took from the  
10 defendant?

11 A. Yes, ma'am. It's got my hand written on it  
12 {sic}.

13 MS. HARVEY: At this time, State offers  
14 into evidence State's Exhibit 110, which would be the  
15 white bag and the three vials inside.

16 **(State's Exhibit No. 110 Offered)**

17 MR. VARELA: No objection to 110, Your  
18 Honor.

19 THE COURT: State's Exhibit 110 is  
20 admitted.

21 **(State's Exhibit No. 110 Admitted)**

22 Q. (By Ms. Harvey) And are these, in fact, the  
23 vials that you were referring to (indicating)?

24 A. Yes, ma'am.

25 Q. Do you see the defendant in the courtroom today

1 from whom -- the person in the courtroom from whom you  
2 took the gunshot residue?

3 A. Yes, ma'am.

4 Q. Can you identify her by pointing her out and  
5 describing an article of clothing that she's wearing?

6 A. She's standing over there with the black  
7 sweater.

8 MS. HARVEY: Can the record reflect that  
9 the witness has identified the defendant?

10 THE COURT: The record will so reflect.

11 MS. HARVEY: And pass the witness.

12 **CROSS-EXAMINATION**

13 **BY MR. VARELA:**

14 Q. Deputy Vu, I just have a couple of questions.  
15 You made some photographs of the scene,  
16 correct?

17 A. Yes, sir.

18 Q. Okay. And you made some -- made a videotape of  
19 the scene as well, right?

20 A. Yes, sir, I did.

21 Q. Who asked you to do that?

22 A. That was Glover.

23 Q. Okay. He was the primary crime scene officer?

24 A. Yes, sir.

25 Q. Now, Deputy Quintanilla was the case agent on

1 this case, correct?

2 A. Yes, sir.

3 Q. And that means he was the lead investigator to  
4 come on the scene and direct the scene, correct?

5 A. Yes, sir.

6 Q. So, Quintanilla had ultimate authority over who  
7 did what, correct, as the case agent?

8 A. On the investigation side, yes, he was the  
9 ultimate.

10 Q. Okay. All right.

11 MR. VARELA: Pass the witness.

12 THE COURT: Anything further?

13 MS. HARVEY: No, Your Honor.

14 THE COURT: May this witness be excused?

15 MS. HARVEY: Yes, Your Honor.

16 THE COURT: Thank you, sir. You may step  
17 down. You're excused.

18 Ladies and gentlemen, at this time, we are  
19 going to recess for the evening. Please keep in mind  
20 the instructions that I gave you yesterday about not  
21 discussing the case, not trying to do any independent  
22 research, not talking to the -- not talking about the  
23 case or doing any electronic discussion of it.
