Q. And in your time with each of the gang units,

do you ever interact with gang members?

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- A. Yes, ma'am, on a daily basis.
- Q. Have you -- well, how do you interact with them?
 - Α. During our activities within the Westside Gang Unit, we would patrol areas that were within our scope and look for gang graffiti areas that gangs would congregate, as well as looking at the criminal history of locations to see what type of criminal behavior, what's going on. example, the Forum Park Crip area, the type of activity that was going on, being conducted criminally by the gang members over there, who was being arrested in the past, who had been charged, were they gang members, compiling all that information and going over there and having either consensual stops and conversations with people who are gang members, or conducting criminal investigations where we would contact suspects, check their gang affiliation, did they have tattoos, did they self-admit to being a gang member, were they wearing that type of clothing, were they associating with other gang members, and through that, documenting them as a criminal street gang members.
- Q. And have you investigated few or many crimes involving gangs or gang members?
 - A. Very many.

- Q. Do you know an individual by the name of Patrick Sowells?
- 3 A. Yes, ma'am, I do.
 - Q. And how do you know him -- or know of him?
- 5 A. Patrick Sowells was a member of the Forum Park 6 Crip criminal street gang.
 - Q. Okay.

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- A. Was involved in several criminal investigations during my tenure out of the Westside Gang Unit.
- 10 Q. And what is the Forum Park Crips?
 - A. Forum Park Crips were a very small, yet violent, criminal street gang that was predominantly in the Forum Park Apartment complex. There was a street called Forum Park. On either side of the street are several apartment complexes. It was a Crip set of criminal street gang members who congregated to that area, claimed that area as their own, and came up with the name of the Forum Park Crips. Although they were not a large criminal street gang, they were very, very influential in that area through the sale of narcotics, robberies, and even murders.
- Q. Now, do you know approximately how many people are in the Forum Park Crips?
- A. We have run across in excess of 25, but I don't 25 know the exact number. Some come in and claim that area,

1 and they are friends with them, and then they leave, and 2 we may run across them later. But there was at least a core of about 25 that we ran across. 3 4 Do you know if the Forum Park Crips have some 5 sort of organizational structure to them? 6 Absolutely. Α. 7 Have you been able to ascertain who is in what Q. 8 position in that -- in the Forum Park Crips? 9 Α. Yes, ma'am. 10 MS. BELL: Objection, Your Honor. I believe it will call for speculation and will be a 11 violation of the confrontational clause. 12 1.3 THE COURT: It's overruled. 14 Through investigating the Forum Park Crips, Α. 15 unlike any other criminal street gang out in the westside 16 area, they were the one street gang that was out there 17 that had a clear, defined organizational chart, if you 18 will. The gang was initially created by a person 19 internally incarcerated by the name of Decovan Reed, known 20 by the street name of D-Loc. He went to jail for engaging 2.1 in criminal activity as a result of a homicide 22 investigation. When he went to jail --23 MS. BELL: Objection to the narrative.

- Forum Park area, the area that's been dominated by the Forum Park Crips.
 - Q. And page 4?

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- A. Addresses on Forum Park, 10110 Forum Park, the Sugar Branch Townhomes; 10101 Forum Park; and 9898 Forum Park.
 - Q. Page 5, what is this?
 - A. This kind of gives an idea of some of the criminal activities that the Forum Park Crips were involved in through their prior arrests or criminal activity up until March of 2012.
- 12 Q. What is this?
- A. It explains what their -- their primary method
 of generating revenue was through narcotics sales. They
 also conducted robberies, dope rips of other narcotics
 sales persons, and they controlled the Forum Park area
 through violence and intimidation.
 - Q. Okay. And what is this?
- A. This is a social media photograph that was obtained that identifies all of the key players, the leadership, if you will, of the Forum Park Crips.
 - Q. And is Patrick Sowells in this picture?
- A. Yes. Patrick Sowells is positioned there
 (indicating). This was the current leader at the time,
 Poppa C. That was his right-hand man, Patrick Sowells.

- Q. Just so the record is clear, Patrick Sowells
 you pointed out as the person who is second from the left
 in the white, looks like, tank top?
 - A. That is correct.
- Q. And the person standing next to him, to his -to his left but to our right, who is that?
 - A. This is Will Horhn.
- 8 Q. Okay.

- 9 A. Joshua Horhn, Fred Whitfield -- I'm sorry -10 Robert Whitfield and Tevin Lewis.
- 11 Q. And do you know who the person in the blue 12 shirt is down on the bottom row?

 - Q. Okay. So, he was arrested and had been in custody the day before Poppa C was buried, but all up until the day before, he was the leader?
 - A. Yeah, he -- they had a vigil for Poppa C right after his death. It was clear at that vigil that Patrick Sowells was the man in charge. He was essentially running the vigil. Everybody was coming to him. As we stopped people leaving that vigil, they identified him as the person in charge, and that he was calling the shots for the gang at that time.
- Q. For all of about three days before he went into custody finally forever on this one, this case?
- A. He didn't go into custody forever,
 unfortunately. He got out on several bonds.
- Q. Oh, no, I'm talking about the date of the death.
- A. Yeah, from the date of his death until
 currently, he's still identified and still looked up to as
 the leader of the Forum Park Crips by the members of that
 criminal street gang.
